Men's Soccer News and Notes

Augsburg

- Augsburg (9-3-5 overall, 6-2-1 MIAC) clinched a berth in the four-team MIAC postseason playoffs for the second time in program history this week with a 0-0, two-overtime tie at St. John's on Saturday. On Tuesday, the Auggies scored a 2-0 nonconference win at Northwestern-Roseville. This Friday, the Auggies close the regular season with a home game against Macalester at 7 p.m. at Edor Nelson Field.

- James See (SR, Richfield, Minn./Holy Angels HS) had a goal and an assist, and D.J. Wendell (JR, Princeton, Minn./Charles M. Russell (Mont.) HS) scored his team-leading 10th goal of the season in the 2-0 win at Northwestern. Wendell scored in the eighth minute, assisted by See, and See scored his first goal of the season in the 67th minute, off a free kick by Lucas Ingram (JR, Woodbury, Minn.).
- Against St. John's, Pascaul Venter (JR, Rochester, Minn./John Marshall HS) collected seven saves in goal in recording his fifth shutout of the season and 18th of his career. Augsburg outshot St. John's by a 22-14 margin in the game, including a 3-2 edge in the 20 minutes of overtime. Van Hong (SO, St. Louis Park, Minn.) had four shots for the Auggies, while James See (SR, Richfield, Minn./Holy Angels HS), Andrew Seidel (SR, Woodbury, Minn.) and David Scheller (FY, Maple Grove, Minn.) had three shots each.

Bethel

- Andreas Scott (So., Cedar, Minn.) had a stellar week for the Royals as he scored a hat trick last Tuesday to lead Bethel over Martin Luther 5-1. Scott went on to score Bethel's lone goal in a 2-1 loss to Concordia last Saturday. Scott now has 18 points on six goals and six assists.

- The last Royal to score three goals in one game was none other than current head coach, Pepe Jon Chavez. Chavez scored three goals against Augsburg on September 21, 2002.

- The Royals are now 1-8 in MIAC play and 4-12 overall and are set to play an away game against Simpson College, which is scheduled for Oct. 2th, at 5 p.m. in Indianola, Iowa.

Carleton

- The Knights (14-1-2, 7-1-1 MIAC) have matched the school record for most victories in a season (14 in 2007). Carleton remained No. 8 in this week's NSCAA/adidas® national rankings, the highest the program has ever been listed. This is the fifth straight week that the Knights have held down this position. Carleton is once again slotted first in the west region and sits alone atop the MIAC heading into the final week of action.

- The Carleton defense was impenetrable once again in a scoreless draw at North Park University (the No. 9 team in the central region). The Knights have allowed only one goal over the last 790:26, spanning nine matches.

- The Knights conclude the regular season on Saturday when they host cross-town rival St. Olaf College. It will be the final regular-season match for eight seniors, including Bobby Phillips (Vadnais Heights, Minn./Mounds View), Carleton's all-time leading goal scorer (28G, 22A, 78 pts).

Concordia

- Concordia senior forward Justin Foss (Fargo, N.D./Fargo South HS) scored a pair of goals against Bethel on Saturday in the Cobbers' 2-1 win and has now scored eight goals in the last five games. He has also scored two goals in three of those games. Foss now has 13 goals on the season which leads the MIAC. The 13 goals is also the second most in Cobber men's soccer history. Second only to former MIAC MVP Peter Curry who had 16 goals in 1994. Foss also has 28 points on the year which is third best in the MIAC.

- Concordia is 8-8-0 on the season marking the latest the team has been at the .500 mark since the 2001 season. The eight wins are also the most since the 2001 campaign as well.

- Cobber sophomore Marco Riboli (Bergamo, Italy) still leads the MIAC in assists. Riboli has seven assists in conference play and 11 overall assists. His 11 assists are third best in school history.

Gustavus

- The Gustavus men's soccer team will wrap up regular season play with an important conference match at home against St. Thomas on Saturday at 1:00 pm. The Gusties are still in the running to claim their fifth consecutive league title, however they are going to need to defeat St. Thomas and get some help from St. Olaf for that to happen.

- Coach Larry Zelenz's squad is currently in second place with a league mark of 7-2-0 (14 points). Carleton is currently in first at 7-1-1 (15 points).

- The Gusties have clinched a spot in the MIAC Playoffs for the sixth consecutive

year. Gustavus is the only men's soccer program in the MIAC that has qualified for the MIAC Post-Season Tournament every year since it started in 2003.

Hamline

- In their lone game last week, the Pipers tied St. Olaf, 3-3, in double-overtime to close out conference play. With one game remaining at Central on Friday, October 31st at 3 p.m., the Pipers' record is 3-9-3, 1-6-3 MIAC.

- Drew Lukas (Sr., South Saint Paul, Minn.) scored two goals at St. Olaf, while senior Mike Buehler (Cumming, Iowa) tallied his first goal of the season for the other Hamline score. Lukas leads the Pipers with 21 points (10 goals, one assist).
- Sophomore Moe Tageldin (Rochester, Minn.) had two assists, while junior Matt Warhol (Jr., Andover, Minn.) also had an assist. Tageldin is second on the team in scoring with 13 points (three goals, seven assists), and Warhol is third on the team in scoring with nine points (two goals, five assists).

Macalester

- Gustavus put a stop to any Macalester post-season hopes when the visiting Gusties scored with just 1:15 left on the clock in the second overtime period to beat the Scots 2-1 Friday night (Oct. 24) in St. Paul.

- After Gustavus went up 1-0 early in the second half, Macalester knotted the score 11 minutes later as Ryan Marshall (Fy., Plymouth, Minn. / Robbinsdale Armstrong) headed in his fifth goal of the year on a Jake Rocke (Jr., Lincoln, Neb. / East) assist. That was it until the Gusties netted the game-winner at 108:45.

Saint John's

- Saint John's and Augsburg played to a 0-0 tie on Saturday, Oct. 25th in Colledgeville. Junior goalkeeper Luke Nelson (Caledonia, Minn.) made 15 saves for the Johnnies, while Pascaul Venter made seven stops for the Auggies (9-3-5, 6-2-1 MIAC). Augsburg held a 22-14 edge in shots (15-7 on goal) and fouls, 29-18.

- SJU (10-6-1, 5-3-1 MIAC) ends its 2008 season by playing host to Concordia-Moorhead this Saturday, Nov. 1st. The match is set to begin at 2:30 p.m. at Durenberger Field in Colledgeville.

Saint Mary's

- Last Saturday's win vs. St. Thomas not only snapped the Cardinals' season-high six-game losing streak, but it also put an end to SMU's 22-game MIAC winless streak (0-21-1). It was the Cardinals' first conference win since a 2-0 victory over Concordia on Sept. 30th, 2006, and their first win vs. UST since a 2-0 triumph in 2002.

- Jon Szafranski (Barrington, Ill.) stopped six shots vs. the Tommies en route to his second shutout of the season and the fourth of his career. With his six saves vs. UST, Szafranski — already the all-time career saves leader with 296 — moved within nine saves of SMU's single-season saves record of 152, set by Eric Luzzi in 1994.

- Steve Boussie (Troy, Mich) scored his third goal of the season vs. St. Thomas. It was the second straight game in which Boussie accounted for SMU's lone goal.

St. Olaf

- The St. Olaf men's soccer team (9-6-1, 4-4-1 MIAC) lost a key game at St. Thomas on Wednesday before playing Hamline to a 3-3 tie on Saturday.

- The Oles have been eliminated from the four-team MIAC playoffs, a year removed from making the tournament final. Phil Kennedy put the Oles up 3-2 with 8:29 to play in regulation in Saturday's tie, but a late Hamline goal sent the game into overtime. St. Olaf is now 2-0-1 in overtime games this season.

- St. Olaf has two games left, a non-conference game at Bethany Lutheran on Tuesday and the MIAC finale at nationally-ranked Carleton on Saturday. With a win in either game, St. Olaf would reach at least ten wins for the tenth time in the career of 21st-year head coach Kurt Anderson.

St. Thomas

- The Tommies (12-4-1 overall, 6-2-1 MIAC) secured a MIAC playoff berth for the third time in the six-year history of the format. They scored a 3-0 win over St. Olaf but fell 1-0 at St. Mary's.

- Coach Aaron Macke's team finishes the regular season Saturday at Gustavus, and a win will give them a first-round home playoff game. A victory and a Carleton loss to rival St. Olaf would let the Toms share the MIAC title. The Toms' last MIAC championship was in 1995. One more victory will give the Toms a 13-win season, a total not reached in 30 seasons.

- Since 1997, UST is 0-10-1 vs. this week's foe, Gustavus, including seven one-goal defeats.

Augsburg

- Augsburg (10-3-4 overall, 5-1-4 MIAC) went 1-1 on the week, falling 1-0 at home to Carleton on Wednesday, but rebounding with a 1-0 win over St. Benedict on Saturday. The Auggies remain in the hunt for their fifth straight berth in the four-team MIAC postseason playoffs, and have one regular-season game remaining -- a game Friday at 7:30 p.m. at Macalester.

- Against Carleton, a goal off a missed defensive clearance in the 79th minute was the lone marker of the game for the Knights. Carleton outshot Augsburg by 18-10 in the game. Lacey Hoover (SO, Duluth, Minn./Central HS) had three shots to lead Augsburg, while Felicia Faison (SR, Minneapolis, Minn./South HS) and Katie Medd (SR, Mankato, Minn./East HS) had two shots apiece.

- Against St. Benedict, Kelsey Watsabaugh (SR, Eden Prairie, Minn./Hopkins HS) scored on a corner-kick bender 14 minutes into the game, and goalkeeper Maggie DeGroot (SR, Waukesha, Wis./Waukesha West HS) had seven saves for her single-season school-record-tying 10th shutout of the season. DeGroot, Augsburg's career record-holder in every goalkeeping category, claimed her 37th career victory and 36th shutout of her career with her seven-save effort. She had four saves in the second half, including several close-in saves late in the game. DeGroot tied her single-season school record with her 10th shutout of the season.

Bethel

- Esther Sowles (Sr., Waconia, Minn.) scored half of Bethel's goals and added an assist for nine points during the Royals 8-0 victory over Martin Luther last Tuesday. With her performance, Sowles set a new school record for points in a game. She then went on to score the lone goal in Bethel's game against Concordia last Saturday. She now has 27 goals in her career (including eight in her last four games), and needs just four more to set a new school record, but only has one game left to accomplish the feat.

- Sophie Christiansen (Fr., Portland, Ore.) added five points of her own in Bethel's drubbing of Martin Luther, giving her 28 points in just her first year of collegiate competition.

Then on Saturday, first-years Cassie Burke (Sunfish Lake, Minn./Minnehaha Academy) and Nicole Tomita (Redwood City, Calif./Woodside) had second-half goals as the Knights clinched a berth in the four-team MIAC Playoffs.

- Carleton returns to the MIAC postseason tournament for the second time in three seasons. After advancing to the championship match in 2006, a loss in the regular-season finale kept last year's team out of the playoffs. - Concordia midfielder Abby Habein (Billings, Mont./Billings Senior HS) had a goal and an assist in the win over Bethel. She now has recorded at least three points in three of the last four games. She has 15 points on the year which is second-best on the team.

Gustavus

- The Gustavus women's soccer team posted a mark of 2-0-1 last week with wins over St. Olaf (1-0) and Buena Vista (8-0) and a tie with Macalester (1-1). - The College of Saint Benedict Blazers (6-4 MIAC, 12-5 overall) were defeated by the Augsburg College Auggies (5-1-4 MIAC, 10-3-4 overall) on Saturday 1-0 in a MIAC battle. The loss will keep CSB out of the MIAC Playoffs this fall.

- Sophomore goalkeeper Maija Schmelzer (Rochester, MN, John Marshall) had six saves for the Blazers, and sophomore Chelsi Larson (Minnesota City, MN, Winona Cotter) led the Blazer offense with three shots.

St. Catherine

- Last week the Wildcats played Macalester College to a 0-0 double overtime tie before falling to Carleton College 2-0.

- First year Kaylee Schmit picked up her school record sixth shutout of the season against Macalester.

- The Wildcats close out the season with a pair of home games this week. Wednesday they face Martin Luther College at 3:30 pm and Saturday they host Hamline University at 1 pm.

Saint Mary's

- The Cardinals' loss to UW-Stout on Oct. 23rd snapped their six-game nonconference winning streak. Ironically, it was the Blue Devils who put an end to the Cardinals' 23-game nonconference win streak with a 2-1 victory vs. SMU a year ago. The Cardinals are now 28-2-1 in their last 31 nonconference games and are 28-5-2 in nonconference play since the start of the 2004 season.

- Marie Allen (Wausau, Wis.) accounted for SMU's lone goal vs. the Blue Devils.

- UST, one of six unbeaten women's teams in Division III soccer, could break into the national rankings this week. St. Thomas has scored first in 23 of the 31 games over the last two seasons.
