**SAINT JOHN'S UNIVERSITY 11-8 MIAC, 14-10 OVERALL**



MIAC Men's Basketball Athlete of the Week - Saint John's University senior wing Ryan Lieser (Cold Spring, Minn./Rocori) averaged 21.0 points, 3.0 steals and 2.5 assists in the Johnnies' two MIAC wins last week and became the 31st player in Saint John's history to score 1,000 career points in the process. Lieser totaled 18 points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals in SJU's 82-69 win at Macalester Feb. 13 to reach the scoring milestone in just his third season. Lieser then added 24 points, including the Johnnies' final five points in regulation, in the 69-67 win at Hamline Feb. 16. Stats for the Week: FG: 15-36 (.417), Assists: 5 (2.5 apg), Points: 42 (21.0 ppg), Steals: 6 (3.0 spg), Minutes: 71 (35.5 mpg).

MIAC Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week - University of St. Thomas junior forward Jessica Katch (Urbandale, Iowa/Dowling Catholic) averaged 19.0 ppg, 10.0 rpg, 5.0 assists and 5.0 steals and went over 500 career rebounds in leading the second-place Tommies to a pair of road wins in a 2-0 week. Katch played just 22 minutes in a 27-point win at Augsburg but made a run at a quadruple double with 15 points, nine rebounds, eight assists and six steals. In Saturday's 70-67 win at St. Catherine, Katch had 23 points, 11 rebounds and four steals. She scored nine points in a game-closing 29-14 run over the last 15:03. Katch is the lone MIAC player to rank in the top 10 of conference stats in points, rebounds, steals, assists and blocks. In 73 career games, Katch has 860 points, 501 rebounds, 241 assists, 203 steals and 44 blocks. ## MEN'S NEWS AND NOTES

### Augsburg

- Augsburg (11-12 overall, 9-9 MIAC) continues to make a push for a spot in the six-team MIAC postseason playoffs. After starting the season 0-6, Augsburg has won 11 of its last 17 games, including six of its last seven contests. Conference leader St. Thomas broke Augsburg's five-game winning streak with a 72-60 decision on Wednesday in St. Paul, but Augsburg rebounded with an 85-72 win over Concordia-Moorhead. The Auggies finish the regular season with games at St. Mary's on Wednesday and at Bethel on Saturday.

- Guard Jon Cassens (SO, Prior Lake, Minn.) stands 13th among MIAC players in overall scoring (14.9 ppg) and first in assists (5.04 apg). His 1.49 assist-to-turnover ratio is seventh-best in league play. Teammate Justin Kozlowski (SR, Wausau, Wis./Wausau Newman HS) stands second among MIAC players in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.90) and fourth in assists (4.13 apg).

- Center Femi Solaja (SR, Cottage Grove, Minn.) has recorded double-figure scoring efforts in his last seven straight games, including a 16-point, nine-rebound effort against St. Thomas and an 18-point, four-rebound effort against Concordia. Solaja currently stands 14th among MIAC players in overall scoring (14.4 ppg) and second in rebounding (10.3 rpg), as one of only two MIAC players to average a double-double in overall play. His conference-leading .627 field-goal percentage (138-of-220) ranks No. 9 nationally among Division III players.

### Bethel

- After a tough 69-65 overtime loss to St. Olaf last Wednesday, the Royals bounced back to defeat Saint Mary's 78-61, keeping their playoff hopes alive. They are currently 1/2 game out of the sixth and final playoff spot with two games left to go.

- Mike Much (So., Champlin, Minn.) has seen more playing time of late, due to the absence of Cory Laugen (Jr., Blaine, Minn.) in the lineup. Much has started three of Bethel's last five games and is averaging 8.6 points per game in those five contests. He most recently stepped up to have a 19 point effort against Saint Mary's on 9-for-12 shooting from the floor.

- Tim Madson (Jr., Redwood Falls, Minn.) reached 500 points for the second straight season by scoring 23 against Saint Mary's. His season total now stands at 509, which surpasses his total from a year ago, with two games left to play.

### Carleton

- Senior wing Tommy Drake (Eden Prairie, Minn.) and junior forward Zach Johnson (Apple Valley, Minn./Eastview) are the only two players to rank among the MIAC overall leaders in points, rebounds and assists this season. Drake is averaging 12.3 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.7 assists this season. Johnson is third in the conference with 19.7 points per game in addition to 6.5 boards and 3.6 assists. Johnson averaged 23.0 points and 7.0 rebounds last week.

- The Knights have won their last three games to take over sole possession of third place in the conference standings. This win streak coincides with the return of point guard Jeremy Sutherland (So./Eagan, Minn./St. Bernard's) who missed 10 games with a displaced fracture in his shooting hand. Carleton was 5-5 with Sutherland out of the lineup and is 11-2 when he's played.

- Bryan Rosett (Cottage Grove, Minn./Park) has played a pivotal role in Carleton's balanced attack. The sophomore is second on the team with 13.7 points per game this season, while averaging a team-high 6.6 rebounds. He has reached double-digits scores in his last 18 games.

### Concordia

- Concordia senior Luke Linz (Watkins, Minn./Eden Valley-Watkins HS) became the first player in program history to score 1,000 points and grab 500 rebounds in a career on Saturday against Augsburg. Against the Auggies, Linz had a game-high 21 points, grabbed four rebounds, added five assists and three blocks. He now has 1,303 career points and 501 rebounds. He is fourth on the school's all-time scoring list and second in rebounds.

### Concordia Continued ...

- Concordia is currently 10-8 in the MIAC and in fifth place in the league standings. The Cobbers are one of five teams that are fighting for the final four playoff spots. CC finishes off the regular season with a pair of home games. Concordia is 6-2 at home against MIAC opponents this season.

- Concordia freshman Karl Olson (Buffalo, Minn.) continues to lead the MIAC in steals this season. Olson is averaging 2.22 thefts per conference game. In the team's game against Augsburg on Saturday, Olson had a career-high 15 points. It was the first time all season that he has scored in double figures.

### Gustavus

- The Gustavus men's basketball team will wrap up regular season play this week with home games against Hamline on Wednesday and Carleton on Saturday. The Gusties, who split their two games last week by defeating Concordia (51-50) and losing to St. Olaf (68-67), have clinched the #2 seed in the MIAC Post-Season Tournament and will receive a bye in the first round of the playoffs.

- The Gusties will be making their 19th appearance in the 24-year history of the MIAC Post-Season Tournament and eighth consecutive appearance. During current head coach Mark Hanson's 18-year tenure, the Gusties have qualified for the MIAC Playoffs 15 times compiling a record of 19-7 overall and winning seven titles.

- If Gustavus were to finish the regular season with wins over Hamline and Carleton, it would push the programs all-time win total in MIAC play to 850. The Gusties would become only the second program in conference history to post 850 wins following St. Thomas, which has over 900 league victories.

### Hamline

- Hamline dropped a pair of home MIAC games last week, first to Carleton on Wednesday, 68-57, and then to Saint John's, 69-67. The Pipers are 7-16, 5-13 MIAC.

- Against Carleton, Carl Hipp (Fy., Little Canada, Minn.) led the Pipers with 20 points, Tony Thrasher (Jr., Hustisford, Wis.) had 14 points for the Pipers. Thrasher also led Hamline with seven rebounds.

- In the game with Saint John's, Hipp led Hamline with 25 points and nine rebounds, while Tony Thrasher (Jr., Hustisford, Wis.) and Eric Clute (Fy., Hawley, Minn.) each had 12 points.

### Macalester

- St. John's ran out to a 28-10 lead, held off a brief Macalester comeback attempt early in the second half, and went on to gain an 82-69 win over the Scots last Wednesday. Tom Conboy (Sr., Chanhassen, Minn. / Minnetonka) contributed 18 points and 14 rebounds. Brian Ranwick (Sr., Plymouth, Minn. / Minnetonka) and Abe Woldelessie (Sr., Richfield, Minn. / St. Thomas Academy) each went 4-for-8 on three-pointers in the defeat.

- Conboy and Colin Keeley (Fy., Kildeer, Ill. / Stevenson) each had double-doubles Saturday in a 78-62 loss at Carleton. Conboy had 20 points and 10 boards for his 13th double-double of the season and 36th of his career. Keeley made the most of his first career start, providing the Scots with 11 points and 11 rebounds.

- Conboy, who leads the MIAC in scoring and rebounding, has a chance to become the third Scot to top the conference scoring chart over the last 10 years, joining Patrick Russell (1990-2000) and Ben Van Thorre (2003-04). Conboy has accumulated 1,857 points and 818 rebounds at Macalester.

## MEN'S NEWS AND NOTES

### Saint John's

- Saint John's went 2-0 on the road in MIAC action last week by defeating Macalester 82-69 on Feb. 13 and Hamline 69-67 on Feb. 16.
- Senior wing Ryan Lieser (Cold Spring, Minn./Rocori) was named the MIAC Men's Basketball Athlete of the Week after averaging 21.0 points, 3.0 steals and 2.5 assists in the Johnnies' two games last week while becoming the 31st player in Saint John's history to score 1,000 career points. Lieser totaled 18 points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals in SJU's 82-69 win at Macalester Feb. 13, and then added 24 points, including the Johnnies' final five points in regulation, in the 69-67 win at Hamline Feb. 16.
- The Johnnies (14-10, 11-8 MIAC) host No. 17 St. Thomas in the regular season finale this Saturday, Feb. 23. Tip-off is set for 7:30 p.m. at Sexton Arena in Colledgeville.

### Saint Mary's

- With Saturday's loss, the Cardinals — who have now dropped 12 of their last 13 games — are winless on their home floor (0-9) heading into Wednesday's home finale vs. Augsburg. SMU's last home win was an 84-70 victory over Hamline on Jan. 27, 2007, a span of 10 straight games.
- Will Wright (Chicago, Ill.) scored a team-high 17 points for the Cardinals vs. Bethel. It was the 16th time in SMU's 23 games that the SMU freshman has led the team in scoring. Wright, who is averaging a team-leading 17.1 ppg, has scored 10 or more points in 20 of the Cardinals' 23 games.

### St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (12-12, 9-9 MIAC) earned a pair of home conference wins, defeating Bethel 69-65 in overtime on Wednesday before a 68-67 victory over Gustavus on Saturday, to stay in contention for one of the MIAC's six playoff spots. The Oles have won three in a row for the first time this season and five of their last seven.
- St. Olaf, which finishes its regular season on Wednesday when it hosts cross-town foe Carleton, could finish anywhere from third to seventh in the jam-packed middle of the MIAC standings. The Oles made last year's tournament as the sixth seed at 9-11. As many as seven teams could finish this year with 11 wins or more.
- Wednesday's meeting with Carleton is the 195th in the history of the series and has the Goat Trophy on the line. To gain the Goat, a team must sweep the season series from the beholder. Carleton has held the trophy since 2003-04 and 19 of the last 20 seasons. In that stretch the teams have split the season series ten times.

### St. Thomas

- The Tommies (20-3 overall, 16-2 MIAC) have won 10 in a row and won their third consecutive conference championship. Last week's 12-point win over Augsburg ran its conference home win streak to 32. UST is ranked No. 16 in this week's d3hoops.com national poll.
- The Toms close the regular season with tough road games Wednesday night at Concordia-Moorhead and Saturday night at St. John's.
- UST will host an MIAC playoff semifinal game March 28. The top-seeded Tommies are in the MIAC playoffs for the 20th time in 21 seasons and will look to make the playoff championship game for the 12th time in 17 seasons.

## WOMEN'S NEWS AND NOTES

### Augsburg

- Augsburg (6-17 overall, 4-16 MIAC) dropped both of its games during the past week, falling 80-53 to St. Thomas on Wednesday and 75-67 to Concordia-Moorhead on Saturday. Augsburg closes its season with a home game against St. Mary's on Wednesday and a game at Bethel on Saturday.
- Two Auggie seniors have possibilities of joining the 1,000-point club by the end of the week. Katie LaGrave (SR, Okinawa, Japan/Kadena HS) currently has 968 career points, and Kristina Lurken (SR, Kenyon, Minn./Kenyon-Wanamingo HS) has 941 career points, and the duo sits seventh and eighth, respectively, in Augsburg's career scoring record list. Five Augsburg players have reached the 1,000-point barrier in school history; Stefanie Lodermeier (1994-98) holds the school's scoring record with 1,599 points.
- Both Lurken and LaGrave already hold career records for the Auggies. LaGrave has connected on a school-record 147 three-pointers, and Lurken has a school-record 399 career assists. Lurken also sits in 12th place in school history in career steals (132), and stands ninth in school history with 519 career rebounds. LaGrave is currently 16th in school history with 431 career rebounds; Lodermeier has the school record for career rebounds with 956.

### Bethel

- Bethel kept their playoff hopes alive by earning victories over St. Olaf and Saint Mary's last week. The Royals are still mathematically in the hunt, sitting one game out of sixth place with two games left to play.
- Some of Bethel's success in the past week can be attributed to the play of Alexa Grones (Jr., Tamarack, Minn.), who stepped up to score 32 points in their two wins. Grones equaled her season single game high by scoring 10 points on 3-for-5 shooting, including 2-for-3 from behind the arc and 2-for-2 from the line against St. Olaf in the Royals 77-64 win on Wednesday. She also had seven assists and a steal against the Oles. On Saturday, the starting point guard more than doubled her output of the St. Olaf game by scoring 22 points against Saint Mary's in Bethel's 75-68 win over the Cardinals. Grones was 6-for-9 shooting from the floor, including 4-for-5 from the perimeter and 6-for-8 from the free throw line, and also added five assists.
- With her 23 rebounds last week, Annegret Nautsch (Jr., Seattle, Wash.) now has 266 on the season, which is the second best single-season performance in Bethel's history. She now has 638 in her career, which just put her in fourth place all-time at Bethel.

### Carleton

- The Knights have won five consecutive games and find themselves in a tie with Concordia for fourth in the conference. The Knights hold the tie-breaker, however, after sweeping the season series from the Cobbers. Carleton has qualified for the conference post-season tournament all eight year's of the event's history and is one of only three teams to do so. Carleton advanced to the MIAC Playoff title game the first six seasons before losing in the semifinals a year ago.
- Forward Sarah Lincoln (Jr./Rockford, Minn.) notched her second double-double of the season with 12 points and a dozen rebounds to propel Carleton to a 60-52 victory over visiting Macalester College on Saturday. It was her eighth career double-double.
- Hannah Oken-Berg (Jr./Portland, Ore./Lincoln) enters the week with 999 career points. She is already 10th on the school's all-time scoring list and is only 12 points away from eighth place on that chart.

### Concordia

- Concordia currently leads the MIAC in attendance in 2007-08. The Cobbers are averaging 406 fans in their nine home contests this year. The Cobbers finish off the regular season by hosting a pair of games this week. CC faces St. Thomas on Wednesday and St. Mary's on Saturday.
- The Cobbers lead the MIAC in 3-point field goal percentage this season. CC is shooting 35.6% from behind the arc in their 20 league games. Concordia has also connected on at least one 3-point basket in 215 consecutive games. The last time CC was held without a 3-point basket was against St. Ben's on Jan. 29, 2000 (0-for-8).

## WOMEN'S NEWS AND NOTES

### Concordia Continued...

- Cobber freshman guard Maggie Bauernfeind (Rosemount, Minn.) has steadily risen in the ranks of the league's top 3-point shooters and is currently ranked second in 3-point field goal percentage. She has hit on 43.3% of her shots from long range and has made at least one 3-point field goal in the last eight games. In the Cobbers' 75-67 win over Augsburg on Saturday, Bauernfeind made a career-high four 3-point baskets.

### Gustavus

- The Gustavus women's basketball team moved into sole possession of third-place in the MIAC standings with a 15-5 league record compliments of a 76-67 win over Concordia on Monday and a 71-66 win against St. Olaf on Saturday. The Golden Gusties will face playoff hopeful Hamline on Wednesday night in St. Paul at 7:30 p.m. before wrapping up the season against playoff bound Carleton on Saturday in St. Peter at 1 p.m.

- Jess Vadnais (Sr., Hudson, Wis.) and Emily Nelson (Jr., Mankato, Minn.) are two of the best free throw shooters in the league as both are ranked in the top five for free throw percentage. Both players have combined for 156-for-184 from the charity stripe at 84.8 percent.

- The Golden Gusties have a 9-5 record during the final week of the regular season since 2000-01. Gustavus is 5-1 in Wednesday night contests and 4-3 in Saturday afternoon games. However, the Gusties have lost three consecutive regular season finales on Saturday.

### Hamline

- The Pipers lost two games last week on the road, first at Carleton on Wednesday, 67-64, and then at Saint Benedict on Saturday, 82-64. Hamline's record is now 12-11, 10-10 MIAC, as the team remains in sixth place in the MIAC standings.

- In the loss at Carleton, Mary Wilkowski (Fy., Savannah, Ga.) led the Pipers with 19 points, while Jessica Heinen (Jr., Spicer, Minn.) added 13. Heinen went 6-for-6 from the free throw line, while Wilkowski was 7-for-14 from the floor.

- Against Saint Benedict, Rochelle Sather (So., Andover, Minn.) and Wilkowski led the Pipers with 16 points each. Krystal Tschumperlin (Jr., Watkins, Minn.) added 12 points.

### Macalester

- Macalester mounted upset bids last week against St. Benedict and Carleton, but their opponents pulled away at the end to hold on. Ann Baltzer (So., Bismarck, N.D.) registered double-doubles in both games, finishing with 21 points and 10 rebounds against the Blazers and 21 points and 11 boards against the Knights.

- Trina PaStarr (So., Minneapolis, Minn. / Southwest) added 17 points and 10 rebounds against St. Ben's and at Carleton came up with 19 points and eight boards.

- Baltzer and PaStarr ranked sixth and seventh, respectively, in the MIAC in scoring and are each in the top ten in rebounding.

### Saint Benedict

- The College of Saint Benedict basketball team (17-3 MIAC, 19-4 overall) defeated the Hamline Pipers 82-64 last Saturday. In a 40-minute game of tug-o-war, it was CSB that pulled the hardest and most frequently. Both teams continuously pushed back and forth with short, intense spurts of offense. Leading the charge for CSB were sophomore wing Mindy Schmidt (Brooklyn Park, Minn./Champlin Park High School) and junior forward Ariel Tauer (Edina, Minn./Edina High School). Schmidt scored a game-high 21 points, including 6-for-6 free throws. Tauer dominated from inside as she shot 8 of 10 from the field on her way to a career-high 20 points.

- With a CSB win at home or UST loss at Concordia on Wednesday, Feb. 20, the Blazers would secure at least a tie for their third straight MIAC title as well as their sixth out of the last seven league championships.

### Saint Benedict Continued...

- The Blazers continue to lead the league in scoring defense (58.3 ppg), scoring margin (11.6 ppg), FG pct. (.435), least number of turnovers (307) and 3pt field made (6.1 pg). Senior Judy Falvey, (Lakeville, Minn./Lakeville South H.S.) leads the MIAC in 3pt field goal pct (.459), while junior Ariel Tauer, (Edina, Minn./Edina H.S.) leads the conference in field goal pct. (.608)

### St. Catherine

- The Wildcat basketball team split a pair of games last week and will finish their 07-08 campaign this week with a pair of road games at St. Ben's and St. Olaf. The Wildcats conference record currently sits at 7-13, tied for eighth place in the MIAC. The Wildcats are fifth in the conference in scoring averaging 69.9 points per game and are tenth in scoring defense, allowing 71.4 points per game. The Wildcats lead the MIAC in assists per game, averaging 15.7.

### Saint Mary's

- Jess Weisbrod (Rollingstone, Minn.) posted her eighth double-double of the season and 17th of her career vs. Bethel Saturday. Unlike her first seven double-doubles — which were all recorded with double-digit points and rebounds, Saturday's was a 21-point, 10-assist performance. The effort vs. the Royals was one rebounds shy of earning the SMU senior her second career triple-double.

- Weisbrod scored a game-high 16 points vs. St. Catherine last Wednesday, eclipsing the 1,000 career point mark in the process. With her fourth first-half point Wednesday, Weisbrod joined Mary Schultz (1,982), Tricia Rasmussen (1,880), Jamie Rattunde (1,483), Ashley Luehmann (1,438), Kim Gleason (1,283), Vicki Wilson (1,256) and Amy Burns (1,062) in SMU's 1,000-point club.

- The Royals' 75 points in Saturday's 75-68 win over the Cardinals, marked the fourth straight game in which SMU has allowed 70 or more points. It was also the 13th time this season the Cardinals' opponents have eclipsed the 70-point barrier.

### St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (7-16, 6-14 MIAC) dropped each of its two games this week, falling at Bethel on Wednesday and at home to Gustavus, 71-66, on Saturday.

- Jamie Erdahl had 18 points and eight assists and Kristina Stoermer 13 points and 12 rebounds to lead St. Olaf in Saturday's loss to the third place Gusties. St. Olaf led 31-29 at the break behind nine first half points from Kelsey Oja. Oja finished with 12 points and teammate Danielle Stoermer had 16 points, on 8-of-10 shooting, in the loss. Kristina and Danielle Stoermer are ninth and 12th in the MIAC rebounding at 7.1 and 6.0 rebounds/game.

- Erdahl's eight assists gave her 100 for the season and moved the first year point guard within two of MIAC leader Kristina Lurken (Augsburg) and one of second-best Jessica Katch (UST). Erdahl's 100 assists is the most in at least six seasons at St. Olaf.

### St. Thomas

- The Tommies (17-6 overall, 16-4 MIAC) went 2-0 last week and sit in second place in the conference race with two games to play. With wins at Concordia-Moorhead on Wednesday (5:45 p.m.) and at home Saturday vs. St. Benedict (1 p.m.), the Toms can secure at least a share of the MIAC crown. With a win over St. Ben's and one Gustavus loss, the Toms also can get a first-round playoff bye.

- St. Thomas forward Jessica Katch was named MIAC Player of the Week. Katch averaged 19.0 ppg, 10.0 rpg, 5.0 assists and 5.0 steals and went over 500 career rebounds in leading the second-place Tommies to a pair of road wins in a 2-0 week. Katch played just 22 minutes in a 27-point win at Augsburg but made a run at a quadruple double with 15 points, nine rebounds, eight assists and six steals. In Saturday's 70-67 win at St. Catherine, Katch had 23 points, 11 rebounds and four steals. She scored nine points in a game-closing 29-14 run over the last 15:03.

- Katch is the lone MIAC player to rank in the top 10 of conference stats in points, rebounds, steals, assists and blocks. In 73 career games, Katch has 860 points, 501 rebounds, 241 assists, 203 steals and 44 blocks.
