MIAC Men's Hockey Athlete of the Week - University of St. Thomas sophomore goaltender Tyler Chestnut (Fairbault, Minn./Shattuck-St. Mary's) stopped 39 of 40 shots to help the Tommies to a key sweep of Saint Mary's that kept alive their MIAC championship hopes. Chestnut and his teammates killed off all 13 Cardinal power plays. Saturday's shutout was Chestnut's fourth of the season, and he ranks 10th nationally in GAA at 2.11 along with a .910 save percentage. The No. 8-ranked Tommies can secure at least a share of the MIAC crown with three points this weekend vs. St. Olaf.

She now has six shutouts on the season. Bradel and her teammates killed off all 12 power-play tries on the weekend, and Bradel has a streak of 52 consecutive power-play kills over her last 12 games. Bradel is now 14-4 on the season and ranks in the top eight nationally in both save percentage (.950) and GAA (1.17).

## MEN'S HOCKEY NEWS AND NOTES

### Augsburg

- Augsburg (5-16-2 overall, 3-11-0 MIAC) was swept in a weekend series by Hamline, falling both nights by 4-3 decisions. The Auggies close their season this weekend with a series against St. Mary's, with Friday's game in Winona and Saturday's game at Augsburg.
- Augsburg forward Chris Johnson (SO, Verona, Wis./Madison Memorial HS) led the Auggies with a three-point weekend, with a goal and assist on Friday and a goal on Saturday. Johnson has a four-game point streak, and currently leads the team in overall scoring (eight goals, 13 assists, 21 points).
- Augsburg forward Jim Jensen (FY, Plymouth, Minn./Osseo HS) has a five-game point streak (two goals, three assists), while teammate Brett Way (JR, Grand Ledge, Mich.) has a four-game point streak (one goal, three assists).

### Bethel

- The Royals finished their regular season on a winning note by sweeping St. Olaf 4-3, and 2-1. The defending MIAC champions have won seven of their last eight conference games on their way to their fourth MIAC playoff appearance in a row. They will now await the results of this weekend's games to determine their seeding for the conference playoffs.
- Each of Bethel's four goals scored in Friday's 4-3 win was scored by a senior playing in their final regular season home game. Jeff Balvin (Maple Grove, Minn.) accounted for two of them, while Steve Eastman (Edina, Minn.) and Dan Bonne (White Bear Lake) scored the other two.
- Bonne's three points against St. Olaf gives him 33 on the season, and 114 in his career to slide him into ninth place among Bethel's all-time leading point scorers.

### Concordia

- The Cobbers' weekend series at Gustavus on Feb. 22-23 marks the final time that head coach Steve Baumgartner will be behind the bench for Concordia. Baumgartner announced his resignation in January and will be stepping down after 22 seasons as head coach. He is the all-time winningest coach in Cobber hockey and ranks third in the MIAC in wins among active coaches.
- Concordia senior goalie Jeremy Boniface (Goderich, Ont.) made 49 saves in the Cobbers' game against St. John's on Sunday. That is a career-high for Boniface. His previous career high came against St. Thomas earlier in the month when he made 45 saves. Boniface leads the Cobbers in saves this season with 444.
- Cobber junior Ryan Clukey (Moorhead, Minn.) is in the top 20 in the MIAC in assists this season. Clukey has nine assists in the team's 14 league games. He is currently tied for the team lead in points with 15.

### Gustavus

- The Gustavus men's hockey team will close out the regular season with a home-and-home series with Concordia this Friday night and Saturday afternoon. The Gusties are currently in fifth place in the MIAC standings and can clinch a playoff spot by earning one-point against the Cobbers this weekend.
- The Gusties, who enter the weekend with a record of 11-11-1 overall, have split six series in league play this season and posted one sweep (over St. Olaf). Two of the Gusties 11 victories have come over ranked opponents including #1 St. Norbert (The Green Knights only loss this season) and #4 St. Thomas.

### Hamline

- Hamline swept Augsburg with a pair of 4-3 victories, upping the Pipers' record to 13-6-3, 9-3-2, and securing the team a spot in the 2008 MIAC playoffs. The appearance will be the first by the Pipers in the playoffs since the five-team post-season system began.
- Junior forward Dustin Fulton (Brooklyn Park, Minn.) had five points on four goals and an assist, including the opening goal and an assist on the game-winner on Friday. On Saturday night, with the Pipers down 2-0, Fulton scored three consecutive goals, including two power play goals.

### Hamline Continued...

- Fulton leads the MIAC in scoring with 1.86 points per game, is tied for first in goal scoring at 0.86 goals per game, and is fifth in assist scoring at 1.00 assists per game. He also leads the MIAC in power play points (1.00 per game) and is second in power play goals (0.43 per game). Nationally, Fulton is tied for 11th in points per game and tied for 15th in goals per game. He is the highest-ranking MIAC player in both categories. Earlier in the week, KARE11 did a feature piece on Fulton's success on the ice and his internship off the ice. - Andrew Birkholz (Jr., Maple Grove, Minn.) scored the game-winner in both games against Augsburg. He also added an assist on Fulton's first goal in the Saturday night game. Defenseman Joe Long (Jr., Dayton, Minn.) had a goal and two assists on the weekend, and is tied for first in goal scoring in the MIAC (0.86 per game), is first in power play goals (0.50 per game), and is tied with teammate Jared Hummel (Fy., Eagan, Minn.) as the top scoring defenseman in the conference (1.29 points per game). Hummel is also the top scoring first-year player in the MIAC.

### Saint John's

- Saint John's clinched a MIAC Playoff berth by sweeping last weekend's series with Concordia-Moorhead, 4-2 and 7-1. SJU will be making its 12th MIAC Playoff appearance in the past 13 seasons next week.
- Saint John's (12-9-2, 8-4-2 MIAC) travels to face Hamline this Friday, Feb. 22 before returning home to host the Pipers Saturday, Feb. 23 in St. Cloud. The puck is scheduled to drop at 2 p.m. at the National Hockey Center.

### Saint Mary's

- With their two losses vs. St. Thomas last weekend, the Cardinals have now been swept in its last three conference series, and have dropped five of their last six and seven of their last nine.
- Karl Reinke (Duluth, Minn.) accounted for SMU's lone goal vs. UST, which was shut out (5-0 on Saturday) for the second time this season.
- SMU has scored two goals or less in 10 of its 13 losses this season.

### St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (8-11-4, 5-6-3 MIAC) was swept by first place Bethel in two one-goal games - 4-3 on Friday at Schwan's Super Rink in Blaine and 2-1 on Saturday at Northfield.
- On Saturday, John Paulson's goal at the 12:03 mark of the third brought St. Olaf, which outshot the visiting first place Royals 40-28, within one.
- The losses all but eliminated St. Olaf from postseason contention. The Oles need a sweep of second place St. Thomas next weekend and for Gustavus to lose their final two games to make the five-team field. - The top five teams make the MIAC Playoffs, which begin Feb. 28. St. Olaf has made four straight MIAC Playoff appearances.

### St. Thomas

- The Tommies (16-5-2 overall, 10-3-1 MIAC) moved up four spots to No. 4 in this week's Division III rankings after a 5-1, 5-0 sweep of St. Mary's. Goalie Tyler Chestnut was named MIAC Player of the Week after he stopped 39 of 40 shots and helped kill off all 13 Cardinal power plays. Saturday's shutout was Chestnut's fourth of the season, and he ranks 10th nationally in GAA at 2.11 along with a .910 save percentage.
- Bethel has ended its regular season and leads the MIAC race in points with 23. But St. Thomas (21 points) can secure at least a tie for the conference title with three points and win the crown outright with a sweep vs. St. Olaf. Hamline (20 points) can also jump ahead of Bethel with a sweep of St. John's. UST is at St. Olaf on Friday night and plays on home ice in Mendota Heights on Saturday night.
- In 65 career games Tommie senior Nick Pernula has 40 goals and 53 assists for 93 points.

## WOMEN'S HOCKEY NEWS AND NOTES

### Augsburg

- Augsburg (3-16-2 overall, 3-11-2 MIAC) dropped a 3-0 decision to Hamline on Friday night, but rebounded with a 2-2, overtime tie with the Pipers on Saturday. The Auggies close their season this weekend with a series against St. Mary's. Friday's game is in Minneapolis, with Saturday's game in Winona.

- Forward Tiffany Magnuson (JR, Green Bay, Wis./Notre Dame Academy HS) leads the team with 19 points (nine goals, 10 assists) and needs just two goals to tie Lauren Chezick (2001-05) for second place on Augsburg's career goal-scoring list with 55 goals. In 71 career games, Magnuson has 53 goals and 23 assists for 76 points. Angie Rieger (1997-2001) holds the school's goal-scoring record with 68; Chezick's 137 points (55 goals, 82 assists) is the school's overall scoring record.

- Defender Jackie Keller (SR, Traverse City, Mich./Traverse City West HS) tied Saturday's game for the Auggies with an unassisted goal with 5:19 left in regulation. Keller is tied for second on the team in overall scoring with 12 points (eight goals, four assists), with a team-best four power-play goals, second-most among MIAC players in overall statistics. Keller is currently tied for fifth among league defenders in scoring, and her eight goals are second-best among league defenders.

### Bethel

- Bethel earned a split in their season series with St. Olaf by defeating them 7-5 in a wild game in Northfield, then losing by a score of 2-1 the following afternoon. Friday night's game featured 12 goals by 11 different players, three goals scored with an extra skater advantage, two power play goals, two empty net goals, and a shorthanded goal. The Royals are clinging to the fifth and final playoff spot entering their final two regular season games against St. Catherine, over whom they hold a one point advantage in the standings.

- Sandra Felten (Jr., Cashton, Wis.) scored five points on two goals and three assists during Bethel's two games last weekend. Felten now has 40 goals in her career, making her just the second in team history to reach that number. She is just four goals shy of becoming Bethel's all-time leading goal scorer.

- Kassy Sullivan (Fr., Roseville, Minn.) earned four points on a goal and three assists to bring her season total to 16, making her one of the top scoring freshmen in the MIAC.

### Concordia

- Concordia clinched its first MIAC playoff berth since the 2002-03 season this past weekend with a two-game sweep over St. Ben's. The Cobbers are 10-4-2 in conference play this year and can finish no worse than third in the conference standings. The 10 league wins is the most since the 2002-03 campaign when they finished in second place with 12 victories.

- The sweep over the Blazers last weekend was the fourth conference sweep of the season. That is the most MIAC sweeps in a single year since CC swept five series in the 2002-03 season.

- Cobber junior forward Kelsey Puffe (Moorhead, Minn.) scored a pair of goals in the team's 4-3 win over St. Ben's on Saturday. It is the first time in her career that she has had a multiple-goal game. Puffe had only one goal in the team's first 22 games of the year before she broke free against CSB.

### Gustavus

- The Gustavus women's hockey team remained undefeated in conference play as the team moved to 16-0-0 in the league and 21-2-0 overall with 3-0 and 5-1 wins over Saint Benedict this past weekend.

- This year's Gustavus team is on pace to allow the fewest total goals in a season in program history. The defense has allowed 22 goals for a 1.00 goals against average. The current mark of 38 goals allowed was set last year. Eleven of the 22 goals allowed this season have come in 16 conference games. The record for the fewest goals allowed in a conference season is nine goals, which was set by the 1999-2000 Saint Mary's Cardinals in a 14-game schedule.

- Gustavus put 74 shots on goal in Friday's 3-0 win over St. Catherine at Ridder Arena. This was the highest number of shots on goal since January 26, 2002 when the Gusties tallied 76 shots against Hamline in a 9-0 victory.

### Hamline

- The Pipers defeated and tied the Augsburg Auggies this weekend, winning 3-0 at home on Friday, and skating to a 2-2 tie on Saturday on the road. The Pipers are now 11-9-3, 6-7-3 MIAC, and sit in fourth place in the conference standings with two games to play.

### Hamline Continued...

- Senior forward Emily Dusold (Shoreview, Minn.) had four points on two goals and two assists in leading the Pipers against Augsburg. In Friday's 3-0 victory, Dusold scored a power play goal and added an assist. In Saturday's 2-2 tie, Dusold scored the opening goal and had an assist on the second goal that ensured that the Pipers collected three out of four available points in the series. Dusold is tied for ninth in the MIAC in assists (0.56 per game).

- Kate Raasch (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) also had an impressive weekend, tallying an assist on Friday, and then adding a goal and an assist on Saturday. Raasch is tied for sixth in the MIAC in goal scoring (0.50 per game).

### Saint Benedict

- The College of Saint Benedict's (4-10-2 MIAC, 4-14-2) impressive offensive strikes, scoring three goals, wasn't enough to take the win as Concordia College (10-4-2 MIAC, 10-9-2) scored one more than CSB for the 4-3 victory.

- The Blazers' Maggie Kinney (Woodbury, Minn.) scored her eighth goal of the season at 7:03 in the third period. From there, Saint Benedict pushed forward but was never able to get the game tying goal. Kinney is the Blazers' top scorer and it was her second goal against the Cobbers during the weekend series.

### St. Catherine

- The Wildcat hockey team enters this week's two game series against Bethel looking to play themselves into the MIAC playoffs for the first time since the 2000-2001 season. The Wildcats currently sit with 13 points in conference play and in sixth place overall. The top five teams qualify for the playoffs and the Wildcats will face the team they are chasing for that fifth playoff spot in a pair of games against Bethel on Thursday and Friday. Bethel has 14 points in conference play which means either a win and a tie or a pair of wins by the Wildcats will secure a spot in the MIAC playoffs.

### Saint Mary's

- The Cardinals dropped both games vs. St. Thomas last weekend, extending their losing streak to four straight. It was also the fourth time in eight MIAC two-game series that SMU has been swept.

- Cierra Lopis (Macomb, Mich.) netted her first collegiate goal in Friday's 5-1 loss to UST, accounting for the Cardinals' lone goal of the series.

- SMU has scored two goals or less in 14 of their 21 games.

### St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (8-14-1, 5-10-1 MIAC) stopped a seven-game losing streak and eight game winless skid with a 2-1 win over Bethel on Saturday to gain an MIAC series split with the Royals. BU won Friday's game 7-5 in Northfield. Friday's loss ended the Oles' postseason hopes. St. Olaf had made four straight MIAC Playoffs appearances. St. Olaf came within two, at 6-4, after it pulled its goaltender to start the third period. In all, the Oles played 11:32 in the final period without a goalie. Melissa Sailor scored twice for the Oles, with each goal coming with an extra skater.

- Saturday, Corbin Ruiz made 22 saves to help St. Olaf to the 2-1 win. Laura Wild and Kim McClintick scored the Oles' goals after BU took a 1-0 lead in the game's first two minutes.

- St. Olaf finishes its season with a series against second place St. Thomas this week. The Oles play at UST on Thursday and host the Tommies on Saturday.

### St. Thomas

- The Tommies (18-5 overall, 12-4 MIAC) moved closer to clinching a home MIAC playoff game with two wins against St. Mary's. UST faces St. Olaf this week (Thursday night at home, Saturday night in Northfield) and needs two points to secure the No. 2 playoff seed.

- Goalie Lauren Bradel was named MIAC Player of the Week after she stopped 41 of 42 shots to lead the Tommies to a 4-1, 5-0 sweep of St. Mary's that secured UST's eighth consecutive MIAC playoff trip. She now has six shutouts on the season. Bradel has a streak of 52 consecutive power-play kills over her last 12 games (12 last weekend). Bradel is now 14-4 on the season and ranks in the top eight nationally in both save percentage (.950) and GAA (1.17).

- Junior Jackie Carroll has 98 career points and is looking to become the fifth St. Thomas player to reach 100. Senior teammate Ashley Reinhardt now has 108 points (50 goals, 58 assists in 103 career games), and she's helped the Tommies post a 75-26-3 record in her era. Carroll and Reinhardt rank in the top five in assists in Division III.
