MIAC Men's Basketball Co-Athlete of the Week - Carleton College sophomore forward Bryan Rosett (Cottage Grove, Minn./Park) recorded his first double-double of the season in Saturday's matchup with St. Thomas. For the week, Rosett averaged 17 points and 9 rebounds for the Knights. He had 13 points and 8 boards in an overtime loss against Saint John's on Wednesday. He followed that performance up with a 21-point, 10-rebound effort versus the Tommies. Rosett's stats for the week: 34 points, 18 rebounds, 11-for-21 FG (52.3 percent), 1-for-3 3FG, 11-for-14 FT (79 percent), 3 assists, 1 block.

MIAC Men's Basketball Co-Athlete of the Week - University of St. Thomas sophomore guard Joe Scott (St. Anthony, Minn./DeLaSalle) averaged 23.5 ppg and 3.0 rpg and made 8-of-16 3-pointers to lead the first-place Tommies to a pair of road victories in a 2-0 week. In Wednesday's 17-point win at Hamline, he scored a career-high 26 points -- 20 in the game's first 21 minutes -- on 11-of-15 shooting. In Saturday's seven-point comeback win at third-place Carleton, Scott scored 21 points and had a steal and layup with 3:27 left that pushed the lead to nine points. Scott is averaging 17.5 ppg in the Toms' six-game winning streak and is shooting 41% from 3-point range with a conference-best 47 treys on the season.

In Wednesday's 73-60 home victory over Carleton, Frank scored 13 points (6-for-12 shooting), grabbed eight rebounds and blocked three shots. In Saturday's 85-65 road win at Bethel, she posted 18 points (9-for-17 shooting), added 15 rebounds (12 offensive boards), four steals and two blocks.

MEN'S NEWS AND NOTES

Augsburg

- Augsburg (8-11 overall, 6-8 MIAC) has won five of its last seven games, including both its games during the last week, a 91-71 win over Hamline on Saturday and a 75-67 win at St. Olaf on Monday. This week, Augsburg hosts Macalester on Wednesday at 7:45 p.m., and hosts St. John's on Saturday at 3 p.m.

- In both victories during the last week, three-point shooting was a major factor. Augsburg hit 12-of-25 from three-point range against Hamline and 11-of-16 against St. Olaf. Over the last seven games, Augsburg has hit at least 10 three-pointers in four of its five victories. Augsburg has hit 60 three-pointers (60-of-146, 41.1 percent) in its last seven games (5-2 record in the span), compared to 61 three-pointers (61-of-203, 30.0 percent) in its first 12 games of the season (3-9 record in the span).

- Center Femi Solaja (SR, Cottage Grove, Minn./St. Paul Harding HS) claimed his seventh double-double of the season and 11th in his two years at Augsburg with 16 points and 10 rebounds against St. Olaf. Solaja hit the double-figure mark in rebounds for the 12th time in Augsburg's 19 games. As the No. 2 rebounder the MIAC and one of only two players (Macalester's Tom Conboy is the other) to average a point-rebound double-double in overall season play, Solaja is averaging 10.9 rebounds and 13.8 points per-game.

Bethel

- The Royals climbed three places in the standings with their 70-66 win over Carleton on Monday, as they have gone 2-1 in their last three games and are now in third place in the MIAC. After a 69-54 loss last Wednesday to Gustavus, Bethel rebounded for a 78-66 win on the road over Saint John's.

- Mike Much (So., Champlin, Minn.) gave an outstanding performance as the sixth man in Monday's game against Carleton by scoring 10 points and grabbing eight rebounds. Much sent Bethel into the locker room with a 32-30 lead at halftime thanks to a last-second tip-in at the buzzer. Three of Much's five baskets came from offensive rebounds that he put back in for points. Much also started the second half in place of Cory Laugen (Jr., Blaine, Minn.) who sat the rest of the game due to a head injury he sustained in the first half.

- Bethel shot 26-for-29 from the free throw line in the second half alone against Saint John's, finishing the game 29-for-33. In that game, Tim Madson (Jr., Redwood Falls, Minn.) was a perfect 9-for-9 from the line, helping him stay the top free throw shooter in the conference.

Carleton

- Zach Johnson (Apple Valley, Minn./Eastview) continues to put together a solid all-around year. The junior forward ranks ninth in school history with 1,259 points and has reached double figures in scoring 17 times over 19 games this season, including seven 20+point efforts. Johnson is averaging 18.5 points, 6.4 rebounds, 5.7 assists and 1.9 steals this season. He is the only MIAC player to rank among league leaders in points, rebounds and assists during conference play.

- Senior wing Tommy Drake (Eden Prairie, Minn.) moved into 10th place on Carleton's all-time scoring list during Monday's contest at Bethel. His 15-point performance raised his career total to 1,216 and pushed him past Roy Hanson '79 into the school Top 10. Drake is averaging 13.2 points per game this season and is shooting 43 percent from beyond the arc.

- Bryan Rosett (Cottage Grove, Minn./Park) was named co-MIAC Player of the week for January 28-February 3. He started the week with a 13-point, 8-rebound effort during the Knights overtime loss to Saint John's on Jan. 30. He followed that performance up with his second career double-double, this one a 21-point, 10-rebound performance versus first-place St. Thomas on Feb. 2. He is second on the team with 14.0 points per game this season, while averaging a team-high 6.8 rebounds. He has reached double-digits scores in his last 15 games.

Concordia

- Concordia senior Luke Linz (Watkins, Minn./Eden Valley-Watkins HS) averaged 20.5 points in the team's two games last week. On Saturday he had 28 points against Macalester marking the sixth time this season he has scored at least 20. It was also the 20th time in his career that he has posted a 20-plus point game.

- Concordia beat Macalester 87-83 on Saturday to complete the season sweep over the Scots. It marks only the second time in the past ten years the Cobbers have swept Macalester in the season series. The last time that CC completed the two-game sweep was in 2004-05. That is the last year CC participated in the MIAC postseason.

- Against the Scots, Concordia shot 60.3% (35-for-58) from the field. It is the third time this season that the Cobbers have shot better than 60.0% from the floor. Not surprisingly CC is 3-0 in those games.

Gustavus

- The Gustavus men's basketball team maintained its grasp on second place in the MIAC with important wins at Bethel (69-54) and at home against Saint John's (70-68) over the past week. With just over two weeks remaining in MIAC regular season play, the Gusties are one game (in the loss column) behind first place St. Thomas (13-2) with a mark of 11-3. Gustavus will finish this week with road games at Saint Mary's on Wednesday and at St. Thomas on Saturday.

- Junior point guard Mike DesLauriers (Minnetonka, Minn./Benilde-St. Margaret's) leads the MIAC in assist to turnover ratio at 2.24 (3.4 apg to 1.5 topg) and ranks 26th in all of Division III at 2.28. DesLauriers has compiled 67 assists (3.5 apg) in 19 games this season including a career-high nine helpers in the Gusties 70-65 win at Carleton on January 21.

- Senior Trevor Wittwer (Redwood Falls, Minn.) continues to write his name in the Gustavus recordbook. Wittwer played his 100th career game against Saint John's on Monday night, which ranks 10th all-time at Gustavus. He also ranks fourth all-time in blocks with 87, fourth all-time in steals with 117, and 25th all-time in points with 1,074.

Hamline

- The Pipers dropped a pair of conference games last week, falling at home to St. Thomas, 92-75, and then on the road at Augsburg, 91-71. Monday night's home game against Saint Mary's was postponed due to poor travel conditions, and will be made up on Monday, February 11, at 7:45 p.m. Hamline is now 7-12, 5-9 MIAC.

- In the St. Thomas loss, Carl Hipp (Fy., Little Canada, Minn.) led Hamline with 22 points and nine rebounds, matching his point total from the first meeting between these two teams in December. Tony Thrasher (Jr., Hustisford, Wis.) added 15 points, and Tanner Anderson (Jr., Eden Prairie, Minn.) had 11 points and eight rebounds.

- Erik Gusaas (So., Bloomington, Minn.) scored a career-high 19 points in the loss to Augsburg. Thrasher added 14 points and seven boards, Hipp had 10 points, and Rhobelle Tekle (Fy., Minneapolis, Minn.) added 11.

Macalester

- Tom Conboy (Sr., Chanhassen, Minn. / Minnetonka) passed Ben Van Thorre '04 to become the program's all-time scoring king when he sank a three-pointer midway through the first half of last Wednesday's 68-65 win over St. Mary's. A four-year starter who has reached double figures in scoring in 91 of 95 career games, Conboy now has 1,776 career points. He currently ranks eighth in the NCAA Division III in both scoring and rebounding.

- The Scots snapped a frustrating eight-game losing skid when they toppled St. Mary's by three points in Winona, getting 26 points and 14 rebounds from Conboy, and 17 points and seven boards from Kyle Hamblett (Fy., Paris, France / American School). Since then, however, the Scots have fallen to Concordia and St. Thomas, who combined to go 21-for-33 on three-pointers against them.

- Abe Woldelessie (Sr., Richfield, Minn. / St. Thomas Academy) has moved up to third in the MIAC in both scoring (19.6) and assists (4.4).

MEN'S NEWS AND NOTES

WOMEN'S NEWS AND NOTES

Saint John's

- Saint John's went 1-2 last week, defeating Carleton 67-66 in overtime on Jan. 30, before falling to Bethel 78-66 (Feb. 2) and Gustavus 70-68 (Feb. 4).
- Senior wing Ryan Lieser (Cold Spring, Minn./Rocori) scored a career-high 27 points and added six assists in the 70-68 loss at Gustavus Monday night. Lieser is averaging 22.5 points and 5.5 assists over the past two games and needs just 36 points to become the 31st player in the storied 105-year history of Saint John's basketball to score 1,000 career points.
- The Johnnies (11-9, 8-7 MIAC) host St. Olaf Wednesday, Feb. 6 in Collegeville before traveling to take on Augsburg Saturday, Feb. 9.

Saint Mary's

- The Cardinals' loss to St. Olaf on Saturday extended their losing streak to nine games, dating back to SMU's lone win of the season, an 89-75 win over the Oles on Jan. 5.
- SMU's 49 points vs. the Oles Saturday was its third-lowest offensive output of the season, while St. Olaf's 58 points were the fewest allowed by the Cardinals this season.
- The Cardinals made 30 of 33 free throws in its two games last week — including a 14-for-14 effort from Will Wright (Chicago, Ill.) and a 9 of 9 showing by Lukas Holland (La Crosse, Wis.)

St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (9-10, 7-7 MIAC) won each of its games this week, beating Concordia 69-45 on Wednesday before a 58-49 win at Saint Mary's University on Saturday. The Oles, who have won six of their last nine, have moved within a half game of sixth place, a game from fourth and a game and a half of third place in the MIAC. The top six teams make the MIAC Playoffs.
- Bobby Hunter had 21 points in Saturday's win at SMU. Hunter has been in double figures in all but one game this season and had at least 18 points in five of the last seven outings and ten times this winter. He has led the team in scoring 13 times. First year Nate Krossschell had a double-double in his first career start on Wednesday with 12 points and ten rebounds.
- St. Olaf hosts Augsburg College on Monday at 7:30 p.m. The Oles, who play at Saint John's University on Wednesday and at Macalester on Saturday, close the regular season with three at home vs. Bethel (Feb. 13), Gustavus (Feb. 16) and Carleton (Feb. 20).

St. Thomas

- The Tommies (17-3 overall, 13-2 MIAC) have won 11 of their last 12 and sit in first place in the conference race with five games to go in the 20-game MIAC regular season. They ran their conference home win streak to 30 with Monday's 100-48 win over Macalester. UST moved up six spots to No. 19 in the d3hoops.com national poll and is ranked sixth nationally in FG% (52 %).
- UST secured its 20th MIAC playoff berth in the last 21 seasons. In Monday's win, the Tommies made 13-of-19 3-point shots, two makes off the school record. They also had a 59-9 advantage in bench scoring. The 52-point win broke a school record for home-court win margin that was set 12 days earlier with a 100-49 win over St. Mary's. The Toms are 22-4 over the last four seasons in February.
- Sophomore guard Joe Scott scored 16 of his 19 points Monday in the first 14:00 of the game and played only 21 minutes on the night. He's averaging 17.5 ppg in the Toms' current seven-game winning streak and is shooting 43% on the season from 3-point range with an MIAC-best 52 made.

Augsburg

- Augsburg (6-13 overall, 4-12 MIAC) went 1-2 in its games last week. Last Wednesday, Augsburg dropped a 71-59 decision at St. Catherine, and fell 91-72 against Hamline on Saturday. On Monday, the Auggies broke a six-game losing streak with a 75-69 home win over St. Olaf. This week, Augsburg hosts Macalester on Wednesday at 5:45 p.m., and plays at St. Benedict on Saturday at 3 p.m.
- Balanced scoring has been a key for the Auggies this season. Augsburg is one of only two teams (Bethel is the other) to have at least four players averaging double-figures in scoring and sitting in the top 25 in scoring in the overall MIAC statistics — center Christa Suedbeck (JR, Hugo, Minn./White Bear Lake HS) sits 15th at 12.6 ppg; guard Kristina Lurken (SR, Kenyon, Minn./Kenyon-Wanamingo HS) sits 17th at 11.8 ppg (and leads the conference in assists at 4.53 apg in overall play); guard Shannon Renne (FY, Nicollet, Minn.) is 20th at 10.7 ppg; and forward Katie LaGrave (SR, Okinawa, Japan/Kadena HS) is 25th at 10.0 ppg.
- Suedbeck, a transfer from Minot State (N.D.), is one of two players (Bethel's Annegret Nautsch is the other) to average a double-double this season, standing second in the league in rebounding (10.4 rpg in overall play) and 15th in scoring (12.1 ppg). Suedbeck is second in the conference with 54 blocked shots; Augsburg's single-season and career record for blocked shots is 72, set by Selina Theisen in the 2003-04 season.

Bethel

- Bethel is still in the midst of the toughest part of their schedule, having played and fallen to three of the top six teams in the conference in the past week, and facing two of the top three for their next games. Losses to Gustavus, Saint Benedict, and most recently, a heartbreaking two-point loss to Carleton, have put the Royals in a three-way tie for seventh place, 1 1/2 games out of the sixth and final playoff spot.
- The Royals continue to be competitive despite losing three players, two of which averaged a combined 16 points per game and more than 20 minutes per game. They will have to play the remainder of the season without the services of starting guard Shari Laugen (So., Blaine, Minn.) who is out with an illness, and sixth player Kristen Wolters (So., St. Cloud, Minn.) who is studying abroad. Jess Gilpin (So., St. Francis, Minn.) and Jenny Holmberg (Fr., North Oaks, Minn.) have been tapped to fill the voids and have answered the call. Gilpin scored 12 points on 4-for-5 three point shooting against Gustavus, while Holmberg scored 11 points in Monday's game against Carleton.
- Annegret Nautsch (Jr., Seattle, Wash.) continues to average a double-double and lead the conference in rebounds and blocked shots.

Carleton

- With the February 4 victory over Bethel, the Knights notched their 10th consecutive season with double-digit conference wins, all under the direction of head coach Tammy Metcalf-Filzen. Carleton had not won more than nine conference games in any of its first 25 seasons of women's basketball.
- Hannah Oken-Berg (Jr./Portland, Ore./Lincoln) has become a bigger factor in the Knights' offense as of late. She is averaging 13.7 points over his last six games after posting 8.8 ppg spanning the first 13 games of the year. Forward Sarah Lincoln (Jr./Rockford, Minn.) continues to lead the Knights with 10.9 points and 6.1 rebounds per game.
- Ally Weaver (Fy./Iowa City, Iowa/West) has made 41 of 43 free throws this season (95.3 percent), tops in the MIAC. She is a perfect 26-for-26 since the calendar turned to 2008. She falls just shy of qualifying for the NCAA leaderboard (2.5 made FT per game), where her percentage would lead the nation, regardless of the division. Weaver was the top free-throw shooter in Iowa her senior year.

Concordia

- Concordia is 11-5 in the MIAC this year. The 11 conference wins marks the 25th consecutive season that Concordia has won at least 10 games in MIAC play. The Cobbers are the only school in the MIAC that has posted 25 consecutive double-digit win seasons in league play.

WOMEN'S NEWS AND NOTES

Concordia Continued...

- Cobber senior post player Melanie Hageman (Fargo, N.D./Fargo South HS) became the fifth player in program history to score 1,500 points in a career. Hageman had a team-high 17 points against St. Kate's on Monday and now has 1,513 points for her career. With her total against the Wildcats she moved into fourth place on the school's all-time scoring list.

- Concordia has five conference losses this season and all five have all come when the Cobbers allow the opposing team to score at least 74 points. In their five league defeats, CC is allowing 77.4 points. In their 11 MIAC wins, the Cobbers are giving up an average of 58.5 points per game. Last week they allowed 58 points to St. Olaf and 50 points against Macalester and won both games. On Monday they gave up 74 points vs. St. Kate's and lost.

Gustavus

- The Gustavus women's basketball team finished the week with a 2-1 record as its winning streak ended at seven games. The Gusties are currently 12-7 overall and 11-5 in the league. The Golden Gusties picked up a 77-67 win over Bethel on Wednesday night, and a 70-60 victory over St. Catherine on Saturday, before suffering a 69-51 loss to Saint Benedict on Monday night. Gustavus will face Saint Mary's (at home), St. Thomas (on the road) and Concordia (at home) in its next three games as playoff seeding starts to take shape.

- Jess Vadnais (Sr., Hudson, Wis.) is approaching two more career milestones including 300 assists and 200 steals. Vadnais is currently at 292 assists and 197 steals. She would become the first player in Gustavus basketball history (male or female) to reach 1,000 points, 300 assists, and 200 steals. Vadnais needs 17 steals to break the career steals mark of 213 set by Betty Wannarka in 1984.

- Over the course of the last eight games, the Gustavus bench has played important role in the team's success. The Gustie bench has averaged 24 points a game as they have outscored the opponents' bench 192-103. Molly Mathiowetz (Fy., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) and Emily Nelson (Jr., Mankato, Minn.) have led the charge with 9.1 points and 7.9 points, respectively.

Hamline

- Hamline split a pair of road games last week, losing to St. Thomas, 71-60, before defeating Augsburg, 91-72. Monday night's home game against Saint Mary's was postponed due to poor travel conditions, and will be made up on Monday, February 11, at 5:45 p.m. The Pipers are now 10-8, 7-8 MIAC.

- Mary Wilkowski (Fy., Savannah, Ga.) led Hamline in the St. Thomas loss with 17 points, while Grace Weinreich (Jr., Wahkon, Minn.) and Krystal Tschumperlin (Jr., Watkins, Minn.) each had 10.

- Rochelle Sather (So., Andover, Minn.) was the leading Piper scorer with 24 points and five rebounds in the win at Augsburg. The Pipers out-rebounded the Auggies 52-33, with Jessica Heinen (Jr., Spicer, Minn.) leading Hamline with eight boards, while Weinreich had seven rebounds. Heinen had 16 points, Nikki Klinck (Fy., Hibbing, Minn.) had 10 points, and Britta Schwartzhoff (Jr., Hayward, Wis.) was the fourth Piper in double-digits with 12 points.

Macalester

- Macalester gained its second straight win when four players reached double figures in a 60-51 victory last Wednesday at St. Mary's as the Scots picked up their eighth MIAC win, surpassing last year's conference total. Danielle Johnson (So., DeForest, Wis. / Madison Edgewood) and Alyssa Lunde (So., Rochester, Minn. / Mayo) led the way with 15 and 14 points, respectively.

- The Scots fell to MIAC title contenders Saturday and Monday, losing 61-50 to Concordia and 68-53 to St. Thomas. Johnson had 15 to pace the team against the Cobbers and Ann Baltzer (So., Bismarck, N.D.) netted 18 points in the loss to UST.

- Four Macalester sophomores rank in the top ten in the MIAC in minutes played.

Saint Benedict

- The College of Saint Benedict basketball team (13-3 MIAC, 15-4 overall) remains tied atop the MIAC after they downed the Gustavus Adolphus Gusties 69-51 on Monday night.

Saint Benedict Continued...

- Sophomore wing Mindy Schmidt, (Brooklyn Park, Minn./Champlin Park H.S.) led all scorers with 20 points, while senior wing Mackenzie O'Neil (Waseca, Minn./Waseca H.S.) added 14 points for the Blazers. First-year post Danielle Frank (Caledonia, Minn./Caledonia H.S.) posted her seventh double-double of the season with 10 points and 14 rebounds.

- CSB continues to lead the MIAC in scoring defense (58.1 pg) scoring margin (9.9 ppg) and 3pt field goals made (5.9 pg). Senior Judy Falvey (Lakeville, Minn./Lakeville) leads the conference in three-point field goal pct (.444), while junior Ariel Tauer (Edina, Minn./Edina H.S.) is the top shooter in the league (.568). Junior Nikki Carter (Edina, Minn./Edina H.S.) has committed the fewest turnovers in the MIAC (25) in 19 games.

St. Catherine

- The College of St. Catherine basketball team kept their playoff hopes alive with a win over Concordia who currently sits third in the MIAC. The Wildcats got strong performances from Rachel Berglund (Sr., Dawson, Minn.) and Brooke Hakanson (Jr., Wheeler, Wis.) who finished with 21 and 17 points respectively. Berglund added six rebounds and Hakanson added five rebounds and three assists in the 74-62 win. The Wildcats have games this week against Carleton and Hamline, two teams that they are trailing in the playoff hunt; these games will be a huge factor in the Wildcats playoff hopes.

Saint Mary's

- The Cardinals' win vs. St. Olaf snapped their six-game losing streak. The streak equaled SMU's longest losing streak of the season. Nine of SMU's last 11 games have been decided by nine points or less.

- The Cardinals' top six offensive performances — including Saturday's 63 points vs. St. Olaf — have all come at home.

- Jesa Hall (Glenwood City, Wis.) scored a career-high 13 points vs. St. Olaf Saturday, marking the first time this season the SMU freshman has netted more than 10 points in a game.

St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (6-12, 5-10 MIAC) lost each of its two games this week - a 71-58 decision to Concordia on Wednesday and a 63-48 loss at Saint Mary's on Saturday. Wednesday's loss snapped a three-game winning streak - which was the first for St. Olaf since 2005-06. Kristina Stoermer added a double-double in the loss to the Cobbers, with 15 points and ten boards. It was her second double-double of the year (Jan. 21 at St. Kate's).

- Elyse Erickson had 17 points and nine rebounds in the loss to Concordia. Erickson, who has led St. Olaf in scoring in 13 games this season, will play her final game of 2007-08 on Monday when the Oles play at Augsburg. Erickson will be leaving for an international study program later in the week. The junior post is playing her first season of basketball at St. Olaf and registered for the study abroad program before she knew she would play basketball.

- St. Olaf was ice cold from the field in Saturday's loss at SMU, making 16-of-52 shots from the field. The 30.8 percent performance was the worst in 12 games and the fewest field goals since the Oles season-opener - a four-point loss at Colorado College in November. The Oles play at Augsburg College on Monday. The road game is the seventh in the last eight for St. Olaf, which hosts first place Saint Ben's on Wednesday.

St. Thomas

- The Tommies (14-5 overall, 13-3 MIAC) went 3-0 last week and clinched an MIAC playoff berth. They have won 12 of their last 13 at Schoenecker Arena and play again at home Wednesday vs. Bethel and Saturday vs. Gustavus.

- In UST's current three-game win streak, Jessica Katch is averaging 16 ppg, 9.0 rpg, 6.0 apg and 2.3 spg. In UST's 10-2 run in 2008 games, Carrie Embree is averaging 15 ppg and 9 rpg

- UST has allowed just 60.8 ppg. The Toms are 7-3 in games decided by seven or less points. They recorded a regular-season sweep of Carleton for the first time in seven seasons.
