Ubl posted a goal and two assists in Gustavus' 5-1 win on Friday night in Minneapolis. On Saturday, Ubl scored two goals including a power-play goal in a 6-0 win in St. Peter. Ubl is the team's leading scorer and the top scorer in the MIAC with 20 points (9g, 11a). The Gusties, who are currently ranked #4 in the USCHO.com poll, have won 17 straight games and are 17-1-0 overall and 12-0-0 in the MIAC.

MEN'S HOCKEY NEWS AND NOTES

Augsburg

- Augsburg (3-14-2 overall, 1-9-0 MIAC) split a conference series with Gustavus, claiming a 4-3 victory in St. Peter on Friday, while falling 2-1 at home to the Gusties on Saturday. This weekend, the Auggies travel to face Concordia-Moorhead in a two-game series, with Friday's game at 7 p.m. and Saturday's game at 2 p.m.

- Augsburg forward Cory Ellertson earned MIAC Player of the Week honors for his five-point weekend (two goals, three assists) against the Gusties. Ellertson had a hand in every goal in Friday's win, assisting on the first two tallies and scoring two power-play goals, including the game-winner with 1:35 left in the third period. In Saturday's loss, Ellertson assisted on Augsburg's lone goal, a power-play tally at the 4:05 mark of the first period. Ellertson is now third on the team in scoring (seven goals, four assists, 11 points), including four power-play goals, tied for the team high.

- Augsburg's power play (20-for-112, 17.9 percent) has shown strong improvement in recent weeks. Last weekend against Gustavus, the Auggies went 4-for-6 on the power play (66.7 percent). In January and February, the Auggies have scored 12 goals in 43 power plays (27.9 percent), compared to eight goals in 69 power plays (11.6 percent) in November and December.

Bethel

- The Royals earned their second sweep of a conference opponent in a row and their third of the season by defeating Hamline 5-3, and 4-3 last weekend. Bethel and Hamline entered their series tied for first place in the conference, but with the wins, the Royals now hold sole possession of the top slot with 17 points.

- Matt Hall (Sr., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) scored two goals and had two assists for four points over the weekend. He is now the leading conference scorer with 20 points, and is tied for third for overall scoring among conference players.

- Bethel goalie Aaron Damjanovich (So., Remer, Minn.) continues to be one of the stalwarts of the team this season, saving nearly 92% of the shots fired on him. He currently ranks highest among conference goalies for overall win percentage and is second in the conference in save percentage.

Concordia

- Concordia snapped out of their power play slump against St. Thomas. The Cobbers went 3-for-13 in their series with the Tommies. That followed a stretch of eight games where they were 3-for-49 on the power play.

- Concordia sophomore Shawn Goos (Fergus Falls, Minn.) had an assist in each game against St. Thomas and now leads the Cobbers in scoring with 11 points. Concordia was the last team in the league to have a player break into double digits in scoring on the year.

Gustavus

- The Gustavus men's hockey team split two games with Augsburg last weekend losing 4-3 in St. Peter on Friday night and winning 2-1 in Minneapolis on Saturday night. Interestingly, the Gusties have struggled on Friday night in league play posting a record of 2-4-0, however on Saturday night the team has recorded much better results posting a mark of 5-1-0. Gustavus will play a key MIAC series this weekend against Saint John's. Friday night's game will take place in St. Peter, while Saturday night's game will be played in St. Cloud.

- First year goaltender Josh Swartout (St. Louis Park, Minn.) posted his third consecutive league win as he recorded 23 saves in the Gusties 2-1 win at Augsburg last Saturday. Swartout is unbeaten in his last four starts (3-0-1) with a goals against average of 1.71 and a save percentage of .933. On the season, Swartout is 6-3-1 with a goals against average of 2.09 and a save percentage of .912.

Hamline

- Hamline dropped the two-game series to Bethel by scores of 5-3 on Friday night and 4-3 on Saturday night. The Pipers are 10-5-3, 6-3-1 MIAC, and take on St. Thomas this weekend.

Hamline Continued...

- Chris Berenguer (Eden Prairie, Minn.), Joe Long (Dayton, Minn.), and Nick Zilka (Fy., Mound, Minn.) had the Pipers goals in Friday's loss. Long had two goals and Jim Erickson (Jr., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) had one in Saturday's loss.

- Defenseman Long is tied for first in the conference in goals scored in MIAC games (1.0 goals per game, 10 goals in 10 games), while another Piper defenseman, Jared Hummel (Fy., Eagan, Minn.) is tied for first in the conference in assists (1.3 assists per game, 13 assists in 10 games). Forward Dustin Fulton (Jr., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) is tied for fifth in the conference in points scored (1.6 per game), tied for eighth in goals scored (0.60 per game) and tied for fifth in assists (1.0 per game).

Saint John's

- Saint John's (9-8-2, 5-3-2 MIAC) returns to action after a week off this Friday, Feb. 8 at Gustavus and will host the Gusties Saturday, Feb. 9 for a 7 p.m. opening faceoff at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud. The Johnnies have either defeated or tied GAC in 27 of the last 29 meetings (24-2-3). SJU defeated Gustavus 5-1 in a non-conference game earlier this season on Dec. 12.

Saint Mary's

- Saturday's 2-1 loss marked the seventh one-goal decision in the last eight games between SMU and St. Olaf.

- Saturday's loss was just the fourth time in SMU's 19 games that the Cardinals have failed to score at least two goals in a game. St. Olaf's five goals on Friday, meanwhile, were the most since surrendering eight in an 8-5 loss to Hamline on Jan. 18 and just the fifth time SMU has allowed five or more goals.

- Morgan Shepherd (Brainerd, Minn.), who scored one of SMU's two goals in Friday's 5-2 loss, had his five-game goal-scoring streak snapped in Saturday's 2-1 loss.

St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (8-9-4, 5-4-3 MIAC) swept Saint Mary's 5-2 and 2-1 to move into a fourth place tie in the MIAC with three weekends left. The top five teams make the MIAC Playoffs, which begin Feb. 28. St. Olaf has made four straight MIAC Playoffs appearances.

- Jake Busch made 24 saves on Friday and 25 Saturday to earn his third and fourth wins of the season (4-5-3). Jeff Budish had two goals, including the game-winning short-handed score, and an assist in Friday's win. Budish's game-winner was his first and came at the 19:05 mark of the second. The tally was the third of five unanswered after SMU took a 2-0 lead. Nick Stalock scored the game-winning power play goal at the 8:39 mark of the third period to lead visiting Oles to Saturday's win. Stalock and Budish have 20 points each, good for 15th in the league.

- The Oles are off next weekend and have two MIAC series left - Bethel (Feb. 15-16) and St. Thomas (Feb. 22-23).

St. Thomas

- The Tommies (14-4-1 overall, 8-2 MIAC) moved up three spots to No. 5 in this week's Division III rankings after an 8-2, 4-2 sweep at Concordia-Moorhead. The Tommies, 14-4-1, clinched the program's 26th consecutive winning season. Terry Skrypek will coach his 700th collegiate game, all with the Tommies, next Saturday night when UST faces Hamline.

- With three weekends left in the regular season, UST leads the MIAC in win% at .800 (8-2, 16 points) with Bethel (8-3-1, 17 points) and Hamline (6-3-1, 13 points), Gustavus (7-5, 14 points) and St. John's (5-3-2, 12 points) also with title hopes. UST secured the program's 26th consecutive winning season.

- Junior Adam Davis had a four-point weekend with an early goal each day in the Tommies' sweep of Concordia. Friday, Davis scored a power-play goal that gave UST a 2-0 lead 4:00 into period two, and added two assists. Saturday, his power-play goal 2:00 into period two broke a 0-0 tie and helped pull out a close win. Davis' 10 power-play goals rank second best in the conference, and the Toms are 9-1-1 this season when he's scored a point.

WOMEN'S HOCKEY NEWS AND NOTES

Augsburg

- Augsburg (3-13-1 overall, 3-8-1 MIAC) dropped a two-game series to No. 4-ranked Gustavus last weekend, falling 5-1 on Friday and 6-0 on Saturday. The Auggies host Concordia-Moorhead in an MIAC series this weekend, with Friday's game at 7:05 p.m. and Saturday's game at 2:15 p.m.

- Forward Tiffany Magnuson (JR, Green Bay, Wis./Notre Dame Academy HS) saw her six-game point streak stop on Saturday, as the Auggies were shut out. Magnuson is currently the team's leader in scoring with 16 points (eight goals, eight assists), and has 73 career points (52 goals, 21 assists) in 67 career games. Her goal total is third-most in school history (Angie Rieger has the school record, 68 goals from 1997-2001), and she is just three goals away from tying Lauren Chezick (2001-05) for second place with 55 goals. Magnuson's point total is the fifth-most in school history; the school record is 137 (55 goals, 82 assists) by Chezick.

- Augsburg goalie Toni Menth (SO, Buffalo, Minn.) claimed a career-high 51 saves in Friday's game against Gustavus, and had 43 saves in Saturday's loss. This season, Menth has collected 620 saves for a .909 save percentage, the most saves for any MIAC goalie. Among the 63 goalies listed in the Division III national statistics this week by Collegehockeystats.net, Menth has the second-most saves; Lindsay DeLorie of Plymouth State (N.H.) has 840 saves so far this season.

Bethel

- Bethany Murphy-Aultman (Jr., Grand Rapids, Minn.) became Bethel's all-time leading scorer this past weekend as she helped account for each of the Royals five goals. In Friday night's 2-1 overtime win against Hamline, Murphy-Aultman had two assists to pull into a tie for first place. Then on Saturday night, she had two more assists and scored a goal of her own, surpassing Heidi Govednik ('06) to claim the record. Murphy-Aultman now has 68 points in her career, which ranks eighth among active conference players. Murphy-Aultman becomes the second female athlete this season to set a new school record for Bethel, providing yet another highlight in the 25th anniversary of women's athletics in the MIAC.

- Bethel gambled by pulling goalie Beth Spurrier (Jr., Plymouth, Minn.) on more than one occasion during the third period of Saturday's game, and came out ahead by allowing an empty net goal, yet scoring two goals with a player advantage. Down 4-1, the Royals scored two goals in the final minute of the game to pull within one goal.

- With Bethel's 2-1 win on Friday, the team earned their seventh win, surpassing their last year's season total.

Concordia

- Concordia is 6-4-2 in the MIAC this season and in third place in the MIAC standings. The Cobbers have three league series remaining in the regular season and have a chance to make the conference playoffs for the first time since 2002-03 season.

- Cobber junior forward Alyssa Dahl (Willmar, Minn.) leads the team in scoring in 2007-08. Dahl has three goals and eight assists for 11 points after missing the first five games of the year because of her play for the CC volleyball team. Concordia is 3-0 when Dahl has more than one point in a game.

- Concordia went 0-for-6 on the power play in their series against St. Thomas last weekend. The Cobbers are now 2-for-23 on the power play in the last seven games.

Gustavus

- The Gustavus women's hockey team brought its winning-streak to 17 games and remained undefeated in the MIAC at 17-1-0 overall and 12-0-0 in the league with 5-1 and 6-0 wins over Augsburg this past weekend. The Gusties, who are ranked #4 in the most recent USCHO.com Division III poll, will travel to Stevens Point, Wis. to face #3-UW-Stevens Point on Tuesday night at 7 p.m. The Pointers handed the Gusties their only loss of the season, a 5-1 setback in the season opener on Nov. 3 in St. Peter. Gustavus will face Saint Benedict in a MIAC series starting on Friday night in St. Cloud at 7:30 p.m.

- Since the 2002-03 season, Gustavus is 16-6-1 when playing games on days other than Friday or Saturday, including the playoffs. The Gusties are 7-0 against MIAC opponents in these games and 9-6-1 against non-conference teams during that span.

- Senior forward Stefanie Ubl (Blaine, Minn.) was named MIAC Women's Hockey Player of the Week for the week ending February 4, 2008. Ubl recorded five points (three goals and two assists) in 5-1 and 6-0 wins over Augsburg. She is the team's leading scorer and the top scorer in the MIAC with 20 points (9g, 11a).

Hamline

- The Pipers split their series with Bethel this weekend, falling in overtime at Bethel on Friday night, 2-1, before winning at home, 4-3.

- Kate Raasch (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) led Hamline in scoring two goals in a 4-3 victory over Bethel on Saturday to earn the series split and keep the Pipers in a tie for fifth place in the conference. Raasch is first on the team in goals with 10, and is second in scoring with 13 points. She is also sixth in the conference in goal scoring in MIAC games with seven goals in 12 conference contests.

- Alli Miller (Fy., Fairbault, Minn.) had the lone Piper goal in Friday night's overtime loss.

Saint Benedict

- The fourth overtime game in a row for the College of Saint Benedict (4-6-2 MIAC, 4-10-2) ended in a 3-3 tie against the College of St. Catherine (4-7-1 MIAC, 7-10-2) last Saturday. With St. Kate's leading 3-2 with only 24 seconds left, CSB's Patty King (St. Paul, Minn.) tied the game forcing overtime.

St. Catherine

- The Wildcat hockey team continued their unbeaten streak this past weekend with a win and a tie against the Blazers. On Friday night the Wildcats got goals from Chelsea Crowell (So., Marshall, Minn) and Meghan Boehmer (Fy., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) on their way to a 2-1 overtime victory. On Saturday the Wildcats looked to be headed to their fourth win in a row before a Blazer goal with :24 remaining sent the game into a scoreless overtime and a 3-3 tie. The Wildcats currently have nine points in conference play, just one point behind St. Ben's and Hamline who are chasing the final playoff spot.

Saint Mary's

- SMU's sweep of the Oles gives the Cardinals their first two-game winning streak of the season.

- The Cardinals' five goals Friday were the most scored by SMU this season — a feat equaled the following night. The 10 goals scored vs. St. Olaf were as many as the Cardinals scored in their previous six games combined.

- Ingrid Klockars (Wheaton, Ill.) scored three goals vs. the Oles — two in Friday's win and another on Saturday. Klockars was one of five different players to score in Saturday's 5-4 victory.

St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (7-9-1, 4-5-1 MIAC) was swept by Saint Mary's University 5-4 each night - Friday in Winona and Saturday in Northfield. The losses extended the Oles' winless streak to five - the longest for St. Olaf since the 2002-03 season.

- Saturday's loss offset the first career hat trick of Katie Iraci, who scored twice in the final 2:32 and all three goals in the final 11-plus minutes. Iraci leads the team in goals (10) and is second in points (15).
