## PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



Senior Catcher

### Kyle Johnson - Concordia College



Player of the Week - Concordia College senior catcher Kyle Johnson (Cambridge, Minn./Cambridge-Isanti) hit five home runs in six games including a three-run walkoff bomb against Saint Mary's on Saturday. Johnson hit .563 for the week and posted an unbelievable 1.500 slugging percentage. He also had 11 RBI as the Cobbers went 3-3 and held onto the chance of earning a spot in the MIAC playoffs. Johnson had at least one hit in five of the six games on the week. In four of the six games Johnson had multiple RBI and in game 1 against Saint Mary's he drove in a season-high five runs on a pair of long balls. His game-winning shot in the bottom of the seventh carried over the 25-foot high batter's eye in dead center field.



### Ethan Guevin - Carleton College

Pitcher of the Week - Carleton College senior pitcher Ethan Guevin (Davis, Calif.) went the distance in defeating #7 St. Thomas by a 2-1 score on Saturday, lowering his ERA to 2.83. It was Carleton's first win over UST since 1995. He limited the Tommies, who entered the contest with a MIAC-best .353 team batting average to only five hits (in 23 at bats for a .217 average during the game). Guevin walked a pair and racked up six strikeouts, the second-highest total by a pitcher against St. Thomas this season. He permitted only two runners to get into scoring position all day and closed out the contest with a perfect seventh frame, including two strikeouts. Guevin also started and tossed 1.0 inning in a win over then-second place Macalester on Tuesday.

## News and Notes

### Augsburg

- Augsburg (19-17 overall, 10-8 MIAC) went 3-1 during the past week, keeping pace in the race for a spot in the four-team MIAC postseason playoffs. The Auggies swept St. John's 9-8 (9 innings) and 10-4 on Tuesday, while splitting with Gustavus on Saturday, losing 2-1 and winning 3-0. The Auggies close their regular season on Monday, hosting Concordia-Moorhead at Parade Stadium.

- In Tuesday's sweep of St. John's, leftfielder James Panning (SR, Gibbon, Minn./Gibbon-Fairfax-Winthrop HS) went 7-for-9 at the plate with a double, five RBI and four runs scored. In the second game, Panning went 5-for-5 with three RBI and three runs scored for the Auggies.

- On Saturday, Jon-Eric Urseth (SR, Golden Valley, Minn./Robbinsdale Armstrong HS) struck out three and allowed just three hits in six innings of shutout pitching in the second game, while Kristofer Ozga (SO, Hawthorn Woods, Ill./Stevenson HS) struck out six while allowing just three hits in the first game, taking a no-hitter into the bottom of the seventh inning before the Gusties claimed three hits and the come-from-behind win.

### Bethel

- The Royals went two for two this week in their series against the Concordia Cobbers, winning the games 5-3 and 9-4. With four regular season games left to play, Bethel has an 18-16 overall and 9-7 MIAC record.

- Travis Adams (Sr., Chanhassen, Minn.) allowed three runs on seven hits and three walks but matched his season and career best single game strike out total with nine in the span of 6 2/3 innings. Meanwhile, Ben Turnwall (Sr., Burnsville, Minn.) earned saves in both games by pitching 1/3 of an inning in the first game and 1 1/3 in the second. Both times he came in with runners at the corners and got the first batter he faced out to preserve the lead.

- Tim Oesterlin (Jr., Rochester, Minn.) hit a three-run home run in the top of the seventh of game one, which proved to be the game winner. He was a combined 4-for-7 with four RBIs on the day. Oesterlin leads the MIAC in hits and is second in average.

### Carleton

- The red-hot Knights have won 11 of their last 13, including their first victory over St. Thomas since 1995. Carleton began last week by sweeping then-second place Macalester. The Knights (17-15, 9-5 MIAC entering this week) have matched the 1989 team for the second-highest victory total in Carleton baseball history, trailing only the 1991 conference championship squad that went 24-11. The nine conference wins—with six contests more still on the schedule—gives the Knights their best MIAC mark since going 9-11 back in 1997 and matches the squad's fourth-best total since Carleton rejoined the conference in 1983.

- Senior pitcher Ethan Guevin (Davis, Calif.) was named the MIAC Pitcher of the Week. He went the distance in defeating #7 St. Thomas by a 2-1 score on Saturday, lowering his ERA to 2.83. - Jay Melson (Sr./Cottage Grove, Minn.) was 4-of-8 with a triple, home run and 6 RBI in Carleton's sweep of Macalester on April 21. He then went 3-for-6 with a walk, home run and 2 RBI as the Knights earned a split with St. Thomas. He drew a walk in the bottom of the sixth inning of game one, setting the stage for the Knights to score two in a 2-1 victory. He has been a main cog in Carleton's second-half surge batting .364 with a .773 slugging percentage over the last three weeks.

### Concordia

- Cobber senior catcher Kyle Johnson (Cambridge, Minn.-Cambridge-Isanti HS) hit five home runs in six games and had a 1.50 slugging percentage as Concordia posted a 3-3 record to stay in the hunt for one of the league's four playoff spots. For his efforts he was named to the MIAC Player of the Week. Johnson currently has eight home runs in conference play which is more than nine teams in the conference.

- Concordia senior pitcher/first baseman Scott Schumacher (Thompson, N.D.) has a career-best nine-game hitting streak entering Tuesday's series with St. John's. Schumacher leads the team in RBI in conference games with 17 and is second on the team in average with a .367 mark.

- Concordia beat St. Mary's 6-5 in the first game of their doubleheader on Saturday on a walkoff home run by Kyle Johnson in the seventh inning. It marked the first time all season that CC has come back to win a game after trailing after six innings. The Cobbers were 0-10 when trailing after six innings heading into Saturday.

### Gustavus

- The Gustavus baseball team went 2-2 last week after splitting doubleheaders versus non-conference opponent UW-La Crosse (2-15, 7-4) and Augsburg (2-1, 0-3) to move to 15-17 overall and 7-7 in MIAC play. The Gusties will host St. Olaf on Tuesday at 2:30 p.m., Macalester on Wednesday at 2:30 p.m., and Bethany Lutheran on Thursday at 1 p.m. before closing out the regular season at St. Thomas on Saturday at 1 p.m.

- Sophomore Matt Morgan (Minnetrista, Minn./Blue Springs South) delivered a RBI single in the bottom of the seventh inning to cap off a two-run rally to give Gustavus baseball team a 2-1 walk-off win over Augsburg. Heading into the seventh, the Auggies posted a no-hitter until Mike DesLauriers (Sr., Minnetonka, Minn./Benilde-St. Margaret) recorded a one-out single to start the Gustie rally.

- Gustavus leads the MIAC in fielding percentage at .972 on 13 errors in 461 chances. The defense has been bolstered by solid play in the outfield as Andrew Woitas (Jr., Sleepy Eye, Minn./Sleepy Eye-St. Mary's), Brandon Boyd (So., Hastings, Minn.), Erik Sveen (Fy., Excelsior, Minn./Minnetonka), and Cody Sukalski (So., Blue Earth, Minn./Blue Earth Area) have committed just one error in 78 opportunities. Shortstop Mike DesLauriers is also tied for third in the league with 46 assists.

## News and Notes Continued

### Hamline

- The Pipers went 4-1 last week to up their record to 19-15, 10-6 MIAC. The team is on track to notch their fourth 20+ win season in a row and the fifth in head coach Jason Verdugo's eight-year tenure. They started the week with a split of then #13-ranked St. Thomas on Tuesday, dropping the first game 5-0 before winning the second game, 9-1. They defeated Northwestern in a road non-conference nine-inning game, 12-3, on Wednesday, and then swept Macalester at home on Saturday, 8-4 and 5-1. Hamline will close out the regular season with a double-header at St. Olaf on Wednesday, April 29, at 2:30 p.m. and then will finish at home against Saint John's on Saturday, May 2, at 1:00 p.m. The final home games will be played at St. Anthony High School.

- First-year outfielder Andy King (Ft. Myers, Fla.) went 3-for-3 in the second game against the Tommies, driving in three runs and scoring two of his own to lead them to the 9-1 victory. In the Pipers' four MIAC games last week, King led the team in slugging percentage (.700), on-base percentage (.500) and was 1-for-1 in stolen base attempts in conference play. He had a double and a triple on the week, both in conference play. He hit .400 against conference opponents, key in a week in which only three Pipers hit above .300 in MIAC play against teams the Pipers were battling for a playoff berth.

- First-year pitcher Michael Bland (Minnetonka, Minn.) went up against the previously undefeated and reigning MIAC pitcher of the week to throw a complete game in that 9-1 win over the Tommies. Bland scattered seven hits in the game, walked none, and struck out three batters in the win. In the first game against Macalester, Brett Bugielski (Fy., River Falls, Wis.) took over the Piper pitching duties in the second inning earned the win to up his record to 5-1 as he threw the remaining six innings of the game. He struck out three batters and scattered three hits. Matt Mullendore (So., Amery, Wis.) threw a four-hit complete game on the mound for the Pipers in game two, upping his record to 5-3 as he fanned five Scots and walked just one.

### Macalester

- Macalester dropped its four MIAC games last week, getting swept by Carleton and Hamline, to fall to 8-8 in the MIAC and 17-17 overall. The Scots need to win their final four games to have a chance of getting into the post-season.

- James Murrey (Jr., Western Springs, Ill. / Lyons Township) is first in the MIAC in ERA (1.03) and second in strikeouts (33). As a staff, the Scots rank second in the league in strikeouts.

- The Scots have a pair of the MIAC's leading batters in Graham Brown (Fy., Annandale, Minn.) at .429 in league play and Devin English (Jr., Annapolis, Md. / DeMatha) at .404.

### Saint John's

- SJU (10-18, 5-11 MIAC) went 0-4 in conference play last week. The Johnnies dropped both games to Augsburg, 9-8 (9 inn.) and 10-4, on April 21 and lost both games to St. Olaf, 11-2 and 4-1, on April 25. SJU head coach Jerry Haugen is still six wins shy of 600 for his career with a 594-517-5 (.534) record in 32 seasons.

- Freshman Bert Marsnik (Annandale, Minn.) batted .500 (7-14) in the four games last week, including a double and three RBI.

- The Johnnies return to action Tuesday, April 28, as they travel to face Concordia-Moorhead for a 2:30 p.m. doubleheader in Moorhead. SJU then ends its 2009 season against Hamline on Saturday, May 2, in St. Anthony.

### Saint Mary's

- Kyle Ryan (St. Paul, Minn.), who went 7-for-9 vs. Finlandia last Thursday — grounding out in his first and last at-bats, while stringing together seven straight hits in between — has gone 10-for-17 in the Cardinals' last two doubleheaders.

- The Cardinals' 10-0, 16-0 sweep of Finlandia was a historic performance on a number of different levels: SMU's 16 Game 2 runs were the most since the Cardinals plated 17 in a 17-4 win over Carleton on April 15, 2007; The last time SMU shut out an opponent was a 6-0 victory over Framingham State on March 17, 2007; The last time the Cardinals won back-to-back games via shutout was 2003, when SMU beat UW-Platteville 8-0 on March 22, then blanked Carleton 6-0 the following day; The last time SMU swept a doubleheader without giving up a run was April 24, 2001, when the Cardinals put up a pair of 5-0 wins vs. Carleton; Finlandia's two hits in Game 1 were the fewest allowed by Cardinal pitchers since David Baker and David Dahlstrom combined on a one-hit shutout in a 6-0 win vs. Framingham State on March 17, 2007; The six hits allowed by SMU in Thursday's DH were the fewest since holding Carleton to three hits in both ends of a conference twinbill on April 29, 2001.

- SMU finished its doubleheader vs. Finlandia with 33 hits — including a season-high 20 in Game 2. It was the most hits in a game since SMU banged out 22 in a 15-5 win over Carleton a year ago.

### St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (20-10, 9-5 MIAC) swept an MIAC series from Saint John's University on Saturday in the team's only two games of the week. The Oles were slated to play Gustavus on Sunday and St. Scholastica today (Tuesday, April 28), but rain pushed the series with Gusties back to today, canceling the Oles' doubleheader with St. Scholastica.

- St. Olaf, which has made each of the nine MIAC's four-team playoffs since its inception in 2000, is in a second place tie with six league games remaining. After the twinbill with the Gusties, the Oles host Hamline on Wednesday, play at UW-La Crosse on Thursday before closing the regular season at home against Carleton on Saturday. St. Olaf has won the last seven and 25 of the last 27 against Carleton.

- St. Olaf rode wins from pitchers Brandon Agneberg and Alex Sommer in the 11-2 and 4-1 sweep of Saint John's on Saturday. Agneberg tossed a complete game five-hitter and Erik Nelson went 3-for-4 in the 11-2 game one win. Carson and Tyler Jones had two hits each and Sommer struck out five in his six innings of work in the game two victory.

### St. Thomas

- St. Thomas (23-8 overall, 12-4 MIAC) plays a nine-inning game Tuesday night against the Minnesota Gophers. UST has lost 16 in a row to the U of M since a 1987 doubleheader split, including a 2-1 loss in 1999 and a 10-9 defeat in 1996. The Gophers have nearly 50 consecutive wins vs. MIAC teams since splits with Augsburg and St. Thomas in 1987. The Toms lost 9-2 and 9-1 to the U of M in 2007 and 2005.

- St. Thomas is looking to secure an unprecedented seventh consecutive MIAC title. The Toms start the final week of the conference season with a two-game lead on St. Olaf and Carleton and close the MIAC portion of the schedule with doubleheaders at St. Mary's on Wednesday and at home Saturday against Gustavus. The Toms are trying to reach 30 wins for the 13th time in 14 seasons and reach the NCAA playoffs for the 14th time in the 15-year era of head coach Dennis Denning. The Tommies have won either the MIAC regular-season or playoff championship in each of the last 13 seasons.

- The Tommies have climbed to the No. 7 ranking in the ABCA Division III national poll and are 19th in this week's D3baseball.com rankings. Seven of their eight losses have come by one or two runs. The Toms are 20-1 when they out-hit opponents and 18-2 when they score five or more runs. They have allowed just 106 runs in 31 games (3.4 rpg).
