MEN'S TENNIS NEWS AND NOTES

Bethel

- Bethel tennis had two matches this week, one against Saint John's, which they won 5-4, and one against Concordia, which they also won 9-0. The Royals boast a 9-4 overall and 6-2 conference record as they look forward to their last two matches of regular season play before they participate in the MIAC postseason as the #3 seed for the third consecutive season.

- Tom Ronning (Jr., Alexandria, Minn) was the only Royal to win both his matches against the Johnnies. He finished with a doubles score of 8-2 and a singles of 6-3, 7-6, (7-2). Against Concordia he rallied from behind and forced a tiebreaker set to win his match, finishing 0-6, 7-6 (7-5), 10-8. Ronning has only lost two matches so far this season, and both have been to members of nationally/regionally ranked opponents.

- David Torres (Sr., Arden Hills, Minn.) played the number two spot this week and won 6-4, 6-4 against his Johnnie competition, and also defeated his Concordia opponent, 6-2, 7-5.

Carleton

- An 8-1 victory over Saint John's on Sunday guaranteed Carleton will conclude the season second in the MIAC standings this season, the program's seventh consecutive seventh consecutive top-2 conference finish. The Knights are ranked No. 13 in the central region and will be the No. 2 seed at next weekend's MIAC tournament.

- The week also included a 7-2 win over St. Thomas and a 9-0 triumph over Hamline. Jon Aranda (Fy./Los Angeles, Calif./Loyola) is Carleton's hottest playing having won both singles and doubles at his last four matches.

Concordia

- Cobber sophomore Jordan Swanson (Thief River Falls, Minn.) won two of his final three singles matches in conference play. Swanson, the team's No.4 singles player, posted a win over Jordan Hughes of Carleton who was one of the league's top No.4 singles players.

Gustavus

- The tenth-ranked Gustavus men's tennis team captured its 21st consecutive MIAC championship after defeating Macalester 9-0 and St. Thomas 6-3 on Saturday. The Gusties earned the top seed in the MIAC Playoffs as they finished league play at 9-0 to extend their conference unbeaten streak to 223 matches.

- Gustavus will host the MIAC Playoffs on Friday, May 1 and Saturday, May 2 at the Brown Outdoor Tennis Courts in St. Peter. The top-seeded Gusties, who received a first-round bye, will face the lowest remaining seed on Saturday at 9 a.m. The winner of the post-season championships will earn an automatic bid to NCAA Tournament.

- Ashok Jethwa (Sr., Minot, N.D.) went 2-0 on Saturday at No. 6 singles against Macalester (6-0, 6-1) and No. 4 singles against St. Thomas (6-7 (4), 6-1, 10-5). Jethwa finished the spring season undefeated at 10-0 in dual matches to improve his record to 13-2 this year. He has not lost since September 26 when he fell to Sammy Ramoni of Carthage 6-3, 6-4 in the fourth round of the ITA Midwest Regional Tournament.

Hamline

- The Pipers went 0-3 in MIAC play last week, falling to Saint John's (8-1) and Carleton (9-0) at home before losing a close road match at Saint Mary's, 3-6. The team drops to 1-15, 0-8 MIAC. They will conclude the regular season at Bethel on Wednesday, April 29, at 4:30 p.m.

Hamline (continued)

- Against Saint John's, Bernard Mitambo (Fy., Minneapolis, Minn.) and Sam Teitelbaum (Fy., Afton, Minn.) recorded an 8-5 victory at second doubles for the lone Piper point. Against the Cardinals, Mitambo won at first singles, 6-2, 6-4, and Dan Cromwell (Jr., Forest Lake, Minn.) won in a super-breaker at third singles, 7-6 (7-4), 5-7, 10-5. The Pipers also took an 8-4 victory at third doubles by Kyle Helgemoe (So., Lakeville, Minn.) and Brendan Fitzpatrick (Fy., White Bear Lake, Minn.).

- The Saint Mary's match came down to tie-breakers at fourth and fifth singles as Helgemoe was out-lasted in a third set super-breaker at fourth singles, 6-3, 3-6, 5-10, and Andrew Lutz (Fy., Circle Pines, Minn.) lost in a pair of tie-breakers, 6-7, 6-7 at fifth singles.

Macalester

- The Scots had a rough weekend, dropping 9-0 MIAC matches Friday (April 24) to St. Olaf and Saturday (April 25) to Gustavus.

- With one match remaining on the campaign, Macalester is an even 10-10 overall and in MIAC play is 3-5. The Scots close things out Tuesday (April 28) at Carleton.

Saint John's

- Saint John's (9-8, 5-4 MIAC) ended its regular season with a 1-2 mark in league play last weekend. The Johnnies defeated Saint Mary's, 9-0 (April 25), but fell to Bethel, 5-4 (April 24), and Carleton, 8-1 (April 26), to clinch the No. 5 seed in the MIAC Tournament this Friday and Saturday, May 1-2.

- The Johnnies will face the No. 4 seed, St. Olaf, in the first round of the MIAC Tournament this Friday, May 1, at the Brown Tennis Courts in St. Peter. SJU suffered a 7-2 loss to the Oles in its first outdoor match of the season April 18 in Collegeville.

Saint Mary's

- The SMU men saved their best for last, picking up their first conference win in their last conference match, a 6-3 triumph over Hamline on Sunday.

St. Olaf

- St. Olaf (8-5, 6-3 MIAC) collected an 8-1 men's tennis win over Concordia College-Moorhead on Monday afternoon. The Oles, who have clinched an MIAC playoffs berth, have won four in a row.

- The Oles are a combined 21-5 at the No. 5 and 6 spots, led by John Wight (9-3) and Nick Hubbard-Peters (10-2). The Oles No. 1 singles man -- Ian Pray -- is 8-5 and has won four in a row.

- St. Olaf will compete in this weekend's MIAC playoffs against fifth-seeded Saint John's in the first round.

St. Thomas

- St. Thomas (12-7 overall, 4-5 MIAC) continued its strong play last week with a 9-0 win over St. Mary's; a 6-3 loss to MIAC champion Gustavus; and a 7-2 loss to conference runner-up Carleton. The Toms played the SMU and Gustie matches without their top player, injured Tyler Rice. Against Carleton, the Toms lost 9-8 at third doubles and 8-6 at first doubles, then lost three-set decisions at Nos. 3-4 singles.

- UST tied for sixth in the MIAC standings and took the last playoff spot. UST will face third-seed Bethel in Friday's first round in St. Peter.

- Dan Cooper is 15-3 in singles and 13-5 in doubles. Andrew Michels is 15-4 in singles and 13-6 in doubles. Tyler Rice is 13-4 in singles and 12-5 in doubles. Kevin Walker is 9-7 in singles and 12-6 in doubles.

WOMEN'S TENNIS NEWS AND NOTES

Bethel

- The Royals lost both their matches this week, first to Saint Benedict 8-1, and then Concordia 9-0. They are looking at a 0-9 MIAC and a 1-13 overall record as they anticipate their two final regular season matches.

- Ashley Dohlen (Jr., Morris, Minn.) was the only Bethel player to defeat her opponent this week, and the win came against Saint Benedict when she won in singles, 0-6, 7-5, 10-6.

- LeRoyce Chapman (Sr., Elk River, Minn.) was the only Royal able to force her challenger into a third set in singles against Concordia, and she finished 7-6, 7-5, 6-4.

Carleton

- Coach Luciano Battaglini was selected to coach the United States Tennis Association (USTA) Northern Section 18-and-under Boys Team. The team consists of the top six players from Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota and Northwest Wisconsin as selected by the USTA. Coach Battaglini will work with the boys for several days before they compete in the National Team Championships. He earned this honor in only his second year as Carleton's Head Coach.

- The Knights are ranked No. 9 in the central region and will be the No. 2 seed at next weekend's MIAC tournament. Individually, Kathryn Schmidt (Fy./Hopkins, Minn.) is ranked No. 4 in the region in singles and No. 10 in doubles with Erin Gudul (Fy./North Oaks, Minn./Mounds View). Schmidt is 13-2 in singles while the doubles team is 13-3.

Concordia

- Concordia has seven players with at least seven singles wins on the season. That is more than the past 10 years combined. Andrea Rognlien (Fr., Fargo, N.D./Oak Grove HS) and Ayah Kamel (So., Fargo, N.D./Fargo South HS) lead the team in wins with 11.

- The Cobbers need to win their final MIAC match of the regular season to claim their first-ever playoff berth since the league went to the current six-team playoff format in 2007. Concordia is currently 4-5 in conference play and finishes off the regular season by playing at St. Kate's on Tuesday, Apr. 28 at 4 p.m.

- Concordia's No.2 doubles tandem of Kamel and Ashley Leister (Sr., Thief River Falls, Minn./Lincoln HS) lead the team in doubles victories with 11. They are currently ranked third in the MIAC at No.2 doubles among duos that have played at least 10 matches at No.2 doubles.

Gustavus

- The Gustavus women's tennis team continued its dominance against Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference competition as it defeated St. Thomas 9-0 last Saturday to extend the program's MIAC regular season win streak to 186 matches dating back to 1990. The Gusties did not drop a set on their way to defeating the Tommies and finishing conference play with a perfect 10-0 mark. It is the 18th consecutive title for the Gusties.

- The Gusties enter the MIAC Tournament this weekend on a seven-match win streak. Coach Jon Carlson's squad is the #1 seed in the tournament, which will be played at the Brown Outdoor Tennis Complex on the Gustavus campus. The tournament begins with quarterfinal matches on Friday at 3 pm. The Gusties will play the lowest remaining seed in the semifinals on Saturday morning at 11:30 am. The tournament will conclude with the championship match on Saturday at 3 pm. The winner of the MIAC Tournament receives an automatic bid to the NCAA Championships, which begin next weekend, May 8-9.

Hamline

- The Pipers played just one match last week, falling at Saint Mary's, 2-7. They drop to 2-13, 1-8 MIAC on the season. They will finish out the 2009 season on Tuesday, April 28, at Bethel at 4:30 p.m.

- At Saint Mary's, the Pipers had match victories at third singles and first doubles. Kelly Gust (Sr., East Grand Forks, Minn.) and Liz Gunderson (Sr., New Prague, Minn.) battled out a tie-breaker victory 9-8 (7-1) at first doubles. Kelsey Eatherton (So., White Bear Lake, Minn.) posted the other match victory at third singles, 6-1, 6-1.

Hamline (continued)

- Gunderson dropped a close match at second singles, 6-2, 5-7, 6-10. Sara Mitambo (Sr., Minneapolis, Minn.) was narrowly edged out at fifth singles, dropping a first set tie-breaker and losing the second set by a service break, 6-7 (2-7), 5-7.

Macalester

- The Scots dropped a 5-4 heart-breaker Friday to St. Olaf to put the team's post-season hopes in serious jeopardy. The match began earlier in the week, with Macalester claiming two of three doubles events before rain forced to contest to be picked up later.

- Six of Macalester's nine conference battles to date have been decided by 5-4 final scores (and another by a 6-3 tally) in what has been one of Mac's most exciting seasons ever. The Scots are 3-3 in one-point MIAC decisions and are now 11-6 on the spring campaign and 5-4 in the MIAC.

Saint Benedict

- CSB tennis has had a very successful weekend and added three wins to the victory column.

- The College of Saint Benedict won 7-2 against Concordia last Sunday April 26th. The Blazers captured two of the three doubles matches and five of the six singles matches. Sophomore captain Kylie Huether (Sioux Falls, SD, Washington) and first-year player Alyson Brandell (Elk River, MN, Elk River) dominated the court with an 8-1 victory. Huether also dominated in the singles with a 6-2, 6-1 finish.

St. Catherine

- 7-2 was the magic number for the Wildcats tennis team last week. The team went 2-1 on the week picking up 7-2 victories against Bethel University and UW-River Falls. The team also lost 7-2 to St. Olaf College. The Wildcats are now 7-11 on the season.

- Martha Ginder is 8-2 in her last 10 matches and has improved her overall record to 12-6 on the season. Kasie Rust continues to lead the team with an overall record of 13-5.

- The Wildcats wrap up their season on April 28th when they host Concordia Moorhead.

Saint Mary's

- Rebecca Snyder (Eden Prairie, Minn.) concluded an amazing season with three straight wins at No. 2 singles last week. Snyder finished her freshman season with a perfect 11-0 dual-meet singles record — all at No. 2 — while going 9-3 in doubles play.

St. Olaf

- The St. Olaf women's tennis team won its fifth straight with Monday's 6-3 victory over Concordia College-Moorhead. The Oles will be the third seed in this weekend's MIAC playoffs in St. Peter. St. Olaf will play the sixth seed, who has not been determined.

- The Oles' Claire Carlson, the team's primary No. 4 singles player, has won six straight and is 12-3 overall. The team's No. 5 player, Christine Muller, has won five straight.

St. Thomas

- No. 13-ranked Gustavus scored a 9-0 win over St. Thomas in MIAC women's tennis play Sunday at Moore Lake Lifetime Fitness Center in Fridley. The Toms closed the regular-season 11-6 overall and 6-4 in MIAC matches. UST's Alexandra Frank and Ali Brufflodt lost 8-5 at first doubles in the Tommies' best stand of the match.

- If second-place Carleton beats sixth-place Macalester this week, St. Thomas will be the No. 5 seed in the MIAC Tournament in St. Peter and open play Friday against No. 4-seed St. Ben's.

- Suzanne Brophy is 10-2 in singles and 6-4 in doubles. Ali Brufflodt is 12-5 in singles and 10-7 in doubles. Madeline Gail is 11-5 in singles and 13-3 in doubles. Hadley Syverud is 10-6 in singles and 13-4 in doubles.
